A Good Problem to Have

As many of you have observed, we are seeing a significant growth in the return of the faithful to Mass each weekend. Since January 1st, we have increased about 100 more people each month. In a world of social distancing and intentional deep cleaning, it challenges us to accommodate the worship space, and we are utilizing the Abbey to for the overflow. This, however, is a good problem to have, allowing us to celebrate a second Mass at 5 PM on Saturday and 12 Noon on Sunday. The overflow Masses in the Abbey have been described as "intimate," "prayerful," "focused," "fulfilling," and "FAST"!!! We are looking at ways to expand and accommodate the return, especially as we draw closer to Easter, the good weather, and more parishioners receiving the vaccine. Brainstorming sessions have produced such ideas as outdoor Masses (like Christmas Eve), opening the gym (as in past years), and even expanding the Church (don't worry, that's not going to happen). But, until the COVID protocols, cleaning needs, and social distancing expectations change, we are doing our best to allow for more people to return into the Church.

This past week we celebrated First Penance with our second graders who are preparing for First Holy Communion, allowing for the children and their parents to encounter and experience God's tender mercy. I remember my first pastor once described First Penance as being pelted/stoned by cotton balls. The innocence and beauty of God's favored and beloved children in the process and recognition that sometimes we fail (SIN) and are called to ask for forgiveness. Like the scripture story of the Prodigal Son, we return to a Loving Father waiting for us with open arms and heart.

For all of us, Lent allows us to do an examination of where we are in the spiritual journey. Monsignor Charlie Fink came and shared with us during the Mission the pitfalls we can encounter as we respond to the beckoning of God to be a follower, a disciple. Discipleship can at times be a battle, and like any soldier, we must be prepared for the physical and spiritual war. If you were not able to join us in the Church for the Mission, know that you can watch Monsignor Fink's presentation on our social media - Facebook, YouTube page, and our website – www.stwilliam.org. Next Tuesday night, Fr. Lachlan Cameron will speak into the Tender Heart of the Father – Keeping Us Close to the Mercy of God.

In one of the Lenten Devotionals I was praying with this past week – I was moved by a reflection and wanted to share this with you:

The Father's Mercy: The Father is infinitely merciful. He is ready to forgive anyone who asks for pardon, no matter how big the sin is. He forgave the disobedience of Adam and Eve—the greatest sin in history. He would have forgiven Judas if he had asked for forgiveness. Even if our desire for forgiveness is not perfect – even if our motivation is only to avoid going to hell rather than sorrow for having hurt others or offended God – the Father is willing to forgive. The Father's mercy is to be the measure of his disciples' mercy. What Is Mercy? Jesus explains in the Gospel (Luke 6:36-38) what he expects when he asks for mercy: Stop judging. Stop condemning. Forgive. Too often we compare ourselves to others because we want to justify ourselves. That leads to judging and condemning others. Instead, we should strive to be merciful because everyone is living a difficult life! Mercy requires that we assume everyone is doing their best and, like ourselves, often falling short of their own ideals. By looking at others this way, forgiveness becomes much easier.

We are now three weeks away from Holy Week. Let's slow down and reflect on how we have been making time and space for the Lord. Has this Lent allowed us to open our hearts to be more merciful, prayerful, forgiving, loving, and hopeful? And if not, if we are honest with ourselves, can we say that we have been intentional and generous with our time towards God? Have we embraced the three pillars of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving? Let this week be a week to reset and if necessary, refocus ourselves on the Lord. God is the source of all that we desire for ourselves – and when we are connected to the Lord, we can bring those abundant graces to others. Those graces attract others to what we possess, a relationship and intimacy with God – which will ultimately lead others to God. And that is a good problem to have, my friends, a good problem to have!





