They also have a variety of tail and ear shapes, all important to recognize when grooming. I have competed in Rally and obedience and twice at the AKC Agility Invitational. Although I am no longer showing (I just do agility) I have shown at 2 World Dog shows and all of the shows nearby, the weeks before and after. I showed my Pumik in UKC when we were still in FSS and in AKC when we first came into Miscellaneous. I was the first person the the country who showed Pumik when we officially became a recognized breed.



CA First Look at our future. Marilyn J. Funke shared nearly every moment of Litter Development via Facebook, Email and Wyze whelping box camera! Technology at its' best making every puppy buyer feel involved from the beginning.

Mid-March COVID-19 came to town for what turned into an "unwelcomed extended stay." Plans made prior to State and Federal Health mandates were either postponed or abandoned. Sheltering in place provided for ample time to search out alternatives.

March 31, 2020 via Wyze Camera I was privileged to watch activity in the whelping box as Marilyn and her daughter assisted Catskill Csendes Csobanka BCAT deliver her puppies sired by CH Ego Dog's Fab Fantasy. For the next 2 months I was glued to the live video feed and following virtually every photo on Facebook! An anxious two months, watching nearly every CDC report, cataloging all mandates and safety procedures, wondering if I would be able to travel from NW Indiana to Georgia.

KOA at Nashville North was welcoming and offered contact free reservations, payment and parking. We were good to GO! Blueridge Vista Huba and I headed south for an in person look at what I hoped would be my Karizma puppy bitch. With the help of Waze we rolled into Cumming, Georgia in time for pizza and puppy watching! I had been able to watch via Wyze Camera and "photograph" individual puppy evaluation from a few nights previous. Marilyn and I spent the evening going over each of the pups; talking and learning more about Pumi conformation, pedigrees and temperament. Finally! It was settled; Purple Girl would be coming home with me.

May 29 2020 Contract was signed; May 30th she sang soprano every mile of the 170 to Landrum SC.

Receiving a gracious welcome from Nancy and Meir Ben-Dror, I plugged in the RV and got settled for a couple of days of Pumi-ville activities! Which included the official naming of "Purple Girl." Observing MS Purple's head toss and over the shoulder looks reminded me of a Country Western song by Kelly Clarkson Red High Heels. "Oh, you can watch me walk if you want to, want to - in my red high heels!" PERFECT!!! Now? What is the Hungarian translation? Meir Ben-Dror to the rescue; MS Purple Girl is now Karizma's Piros Magas Sarok. Next up, a call name. Purple is the color of Royalty. Zita of Bourbon-Parma was the wife of Charles, the last monarch of Austria-Hungary. So, her call name, at the suggestion of Nancy Ben-Dror is ZITA!

Pumi activities with Nancy included off leash romping in 12-18" tall grass, playing in clear creeks, hills and woodland trails at F.E.N.C.E. (Foothills Equestrian Nature Center, Tryon NC). Playing at the Covered Bridge and of course a whole day exploration of the Biltmore Estate. For the 700 miles to home, with a stop near Knoxville, TN I had a quiet puppy; or as I prefer to say "a well seasoned show puppy."

Arriving home June 5th we are met with issues all related to COVID-19, no training classes, no dog shows, few places "open" to take a puppy to socialize and experience life. We were lucky that a small puppy class was being offered by a locally owned pet boutique. Six weeks later my favorite trainer was offering classes, limited in number, at Stone City Kennel Club, New Lennox, IL. Zita was able to participate in a S.T.A.R. puppy course.

Again, we were luckier than most, we had United Kennel Club shows nearby that offered "novice puppy" classes which are open to puppies 3 to 6 months. We entered 2 at Centerville, MI for experience; 4 at Trailcreek Dog Training Club, LaPorte, IN where she was awarded Two Best Puppy and Two Reserve Best Puppy in Show.

Of course, there was grooming. Zita's first full groom and haircut, at about 3 months, was by Petcare Dermatech



Specialist, Master Pet Stylist, Meritus, Scott Wasserman at Pet Stylz in Hobart, IN. Normally first puppy grooms are for bath, nails, sanitary cut and maybe some facial hair. Not so with Zita! She took to the whole grooming process like she'd been born in a Salon!

October 10 & 11, 2020 offered two AKC shows in Lima, Ohio. Zita at 6 months, 10 days of age came home from that weekend with ten points. Thrilled beyond words and very proud of how my puppy handled the big ring and outdoor showing with the big dogs.

November found us in Perry, Georgia for the Winter Classic at the State Fair Grounds. Zita's litter mate (Phoebe) Karizma's Felicity Shagwell, was on fire at

those shows! She finished with all major wins and a couple of NOHS Group Placements! Zita, on the other hand had a case of "I've grown legs" and not sure what they are supposed to do." The Perry experience was not a total loss, Thanksgiving Dinner was with Kinberly Thomas, Ginger Butler and Marilyn Funke. Blueridge Vista Huba came home with Rally Intermediate Title, 2 qualifying runs in Fast CAT and a 4 point Major win.

Winter was quiet. I spent a lot of time wondering what 2021 would hold in store. Would COVID-19 be in our rearview mirror or would it dictate every movement of daily living? Huba, Zita and I did a lot of walking in our open parks, Big Maple Lake and Deep River Park are my favorites, and a lot of walking on Main Street for the traffic and the occasional pedestrian.

COVID-19 Vaccine was promising to have life closer to "normal" and "mask free" by July 4th. April in Chesaning, MI was surviving the rain 'n cold and getting control of an exuberant puppy. We did come home with 1 point and the experience of RV Living, which is different from romping in the dog yard and aerial antics with furniture as springboards.

May arrived and with it a promise of better times. Federal and State Mandates regarding masks was lifted. We entered the shows at Fletcher and Concord NC. Zita finished her point requirement for AKC Champion Title on May 31st. We went to Landrum, SC and spent 3 days with Nancy & Meir Ben-Dror; adventures at F.E.N.C.E Chimney Rock, Pontoon Boat Tour of Lake Lure, dinner at a Federal Prison turned Brewery, cook out with Nancy, Meir, Nancy Nelson and Stanley Kovak. Great memories.

Concord, NC Victory Lane Classic Cluster of Dog shows which included two designated regional Specialty Shows for the Hungarian Pumi Club of America, hosted by the Magnolia Pumi Club. Friday was regular show, I kept Zita in her 12-18 month Class with the hope of holding the Major in Bitches.

Pumik Bark? Tell me it is't so!

Lately, there has been a lot of chatter about the Pumik constant barking and maybe some other unwanted behaviors. I would like to address the barking head on.

First of all, first of all AND first of all, there is something called research. When one adopts and All American, it is hit or miss what you will get in terms of size, looks or behavior. Not so, when you get a purebred dog. There are several things one whould research before getting a dog of any breed: size, shedding or non-shedding, dog for specific sport or show, grooming requirements, activity level (good for aprtment or needs space), guard dog, good with kids, noise level and the list goes on and on.

When we had our first litter, 10 years ago, and every litter since, I told every prospective puppy buyer all the traits that would make most sane people run in the opposite direction: They are very noisy, very protective, very active, need off leash runs every day, need a job, must be super socialized, need to go to school, etc. you get the idea. I was always amazed that someone would still want the breed. Of course, I then told them about the wonderful qualities of the Pumi! I really wanted people to be happy with their dog and not return it some time later. Some people thanked me for my honesty and backed off. 14 years ago, when we first started looking at the Pumi, a breeder told us that the Pumi is not a barker! We already knew better and just crossed her off our list as a potential breeder.

I am not here to boast about our dogs. God knows there are things I would love to be different. Having 9 dogs is a challenge and personalities do conflict. However, none of our dogs ever barks in public, except if a dog gets too close to their crate at a trial or show. People have told me for years how well behaved and QUIET our dogs are. I just laugh. I tell them their good behavior in public is from extensive training and willingness to please but come to our house and hear the high-pitched barking! Sometimes I think they bark just to hear themselves bark! Most often they bark to alert or to initiate play with each other or just bark in sheer delight when playing, the drivewayalarm or doorbell rings, etc. I swear some of our girls could break a champagne glass! If my dogs know how to behave in public, I can live with their noise at home. After all, we did sign up for this, didn't we? Maybe it has something to do with teaching kindergarten for 17 out of 31 years that I have learned to ignore the noise level.

The Pumi should not be barking unnecessarily when it is working the stock (except in extreme instances), as it worries the animals. Hungarian shepherds consider incessant and/or unnecessary barking a temperament flaw. Some Pumik bark when first learning about herding. When they develop more self-confidence with experience, they stop barking for no reason while working. Many Pumik bark in the agility ring. None of mine ever did. Maybe I am not exciting enough as a trainer or I am too old to really rev them up, but personally, I like them doing their job quietly, in whatever activity they are engaged.

If one does nothing more than read the Pumi breed standard, a clear picture of what the puppy buyer is in for is evident. In addition, since the Pumi was fully recognized by AKC as the 190th breed, in 2016, there have been so many articles written about the breed, so many more Pumi owners and so many more breeders to consult, ther is really no reason to be ignorant of Pumi characteristics.

The Pumi is not for the first-time dog owner. Its cuteness belies the intensity of this working breed. Owning a Pumi requires understanding, love, diligence, training, lots of socialization and a firm hand. Yes, we spoil our dogs with play, love, treats and loads of toys. They are our pets first and foremost but also have much needed boundaries.

So, anyone who is concerned about their Pumi's barking either did not do their homework, thought they could change the behavior or needs to reassess their approach to life with a Pumi. They are not for everyone.
