I want to thank Pastor Linda Fernandez for providing pulpit supply during my absence last summer. For two summers before that, Pastor Bill Beljean covered for me. However, for this coming absence, June 18-July 31, there were no Lutheran pastors available. Yes, there are plenty of retired pastors in Florida but most of them head north for the winter. I even approached the Episcopal Church for help. Same story. Luckily, I remembered an old friend of mine, Pastor Joe LaDu, who with Kathryn, his wife, are residing at Village on the Isle in Venice. "Sure," Joe said, "I'd be glad to cover for you!" I and Joe worked together when

I was the president of the Venice Ministerium back in the 90s. However, Joe is the former pastor of the Venice United Church of Christ congregation in Venice. That's right. Joe is not a Lutheran pastor.

I regard Joe's help as an opportunity to celebrate the ecumenical oneness of the church. Some years ago, the ELCA, the Presbyterian Church USA, the Reformed Church in America, and the UCC, signed "A Formula of Agreement" pledging mutual recognition of each other's baptism, mutual consultation, and ongoing theological dialogue. The "Formula" also encouraged pulpit exchanges. Similar agreements have been made with the Episcopal Church, the Moravian Church, and the Catholic Church. Unlike the Catholics, Episcopalians, and Lutherans, the United Church of Christ pastors are not in episcopal succession. Therefore, I will consecrate the elements for communion before I leave.

Some of the best moments in my ministry have been ecumenical. I have preached in Catholic churches, in almost all churches of mainline Protestant denominations, and even once in a Greek Orthodox church (in Castro Valley, CA). When I served in Grosse Pointe, Michigan, my friend, Msgr Frank Canfield, frequently called me up and said, "Hey, Ken, I need you on the altar tomorrow for a mutual friend for his/her funeral mass." A few years ago, I received a call from a friend telling me that her husband had died. She asked that I say a few words at his funeral mass in Denton, Texas. I met the presiding priest shortly before the service and he surprised me when he invited me to step forward and deliver the homily. (I quickly had to think of something to make my comments a little longer) Although, before the mass, one of the ladies who prepared everything for the service strictly warned me against receiving the host, the priest placed the host in my hand when I approached the altar to receive a blessing.

The greatest ecumenical moment for me happened when a friend of mine, Sr. Betty Flaherty of the Adrian Dominican order, called to tell me that her father had died. I extended my condolences but she answered, "That's not why I called you. I want you to be on the altar for the concelebration of the mass." I gladly complied. The church was packed and I joined about ten priests at the altar for the concelebration. I did not receive the host out of respect for an agreement between Catholics and Lutherans for mutual reception of the host that had not yet been made. (It still hasn't) The young priest next to me scolded me because I did not receive the host. I explained why. But I think that he and his colleagues would have gladly welcomed me to receive. After the mass, I attended a sit-down dinner for the offspring and relatives of Stephen Flaherty, about 200 people. Sr. Betty introduced me as her friend, Pastor Ken Lentz of the Lutheran Church and all 200 Flaherty's stood and applauded. What did St. Paul say? "One Lord, one faith, one baptism." (Ephesians 4:5)

It seems to me that the times at present are times of declining church membership and recognition in the western world. Certainly, that is all the more reason for expressions of the universal church to recognized each other and stand in solidarity, proclaiming the gospel of Christ and praying for each other. So, give Pastor Joe a warm welcome in June!


Music and Worship


