Christ Lutheran is making progress with hurricane recovery. The sanctuary recovery will be complete when the new carpeting is installed soon. The new organ has been installed and our new organist, Dr. Richard Benedum, is anxious to start tickling the keys.

There was lots of action in the sanctuary recently as crews from Colby, Walker, and the recovery company were working

simultaneously putting the finishing touches on our new look. Ray Colby was wiring the new pipes, Jake Colby was assembling winkers and checking out the case work, Jerry Aker and Ron Streicher from Walker were connecting all of the organ electronic components, and Ernesto and Monica were re-installing vent covers and trim. Our new sanctuary is almost finished and ready to host the organ dedication concert in February.

In the meantime, your church council has met several times for brainstorming sessions to pave the way into a smoother and better functioning lay church administration. To that end, three constitutionally mandated committees will be re-instituted.

The Evangelism Team will plan orientation meetings for new members, prepare information materials, publicize the ministry of the congregation, encourage members to invite and bring neighbors and friends to church, plan events to bring community neighbors to our campus, and help the pastor identify potential new members.

The Stewardship Team will emphasize commitment to tithe, promote the stewardship of time and talent, encourage end-of-life giving, seek written stewardship commitments from each member, and plan and execute annual appeals to support the budget.

The Fellowship Team will plan social and fellowship events, seek volunteers to help set up events, support the fellowship opportunities after worship, and offer fellowship opportunities that will not depend upon the budgeted funds of the congregation.

Please prayerfully consider your commitment as a member of any of the teams. Let me or Dotty Berner know which team you are interested in. Presently the new teams are planning to begin meeting on October 5 (Stewardship), October 6 (Fellowship), and October 7 (Evangelism) at 10 a.m.

October is Church Reformation month. Fraulein Ingetraut von Hosentraeger, Dr. Martin Luther's secretary, has assured me that he will visit at worship on Sunday, October 29. As usual, Jim Jung will pick him up at the Sarasota Airport with our ox cart. (Dr. Luther doesn't trust automobiles yet)

Beginning on September 18, the team from the Colby Organ Company has been busy installing the new organ donated by our member Allen Dreyfuss. Parts for the new \$453,000 organ were spread over all the pews, all necessary for the organ with 3 manuals, 70 stops, and 440 pipes. The work was completed by Oct. 1.

Installers from R. A. Colby Pipe Organ Co.

included Ray Colby and Jake Colby and electricians from the Walker Technical Organ Co. included Jerry Akers and Ron Streicher. The team rented a house in Englewood to house it until their return north. Members were amazed on September 24 when they came to worship and were greeted by seven sets of pipes housed in two cases flanking each side of the faceted cross over and behind the altar. Thanks to Allen Dreyfuss, Dotty Berner, Bob Cosler, and Kendal Cohen, the pews and floors were cleared of dust and grime in time for Sunday services.

"The digital stops in the two cases classify the organ as a hybrid organ," according to donor Allen Dreyfuss. That explains why the installation required technicians from two companies, one for the pipes and casings, and another for the electrical work.

A concert of dedication featuring our new organist, Dr. Richard Benedum, is scheduled for February

There was no Music and Worship Committee meeting held in September or October. The next meeting will be held at 11:00 on November 1st. At that time a date for our new organ dedication concert, presented by Richard Benedum, will be on the agenda. Many volunteers will be needed for this special event. To that end attendance at this meeting is of the utmost importance. It is a huge opportunity for us to interest new members. I encourage all to get on board.


