We begin the holiday season under the cloud of global violence. Violence in Ukraine, violence in the Middle East and violence in Maine (today I heard that the gunman killed 16 and injured dozens more).

On Friday evening, October 20, I and Dotty Berner, Allen Dreyfuss, and Bob Cosler, accepted the invitation of the members of the Jewish Congregation of Venice to attend Shabbat, their Friday evening services. The service was led by their cantor, Marci Vitkus, who did an excellent job of leading the Jewish members and the non-Hebrew

speaking visitors from five local Christian congregations through the Hebrew service. I was happy to see that we were all led in prayer not only in behalf of those who mourn the loss of Israeli citizens but also for the innocent Palestinians in the Gaza Strip under the tyrannical heal of Hamas militants

Last Thursday, I received a letter written to the ELCA by our presiding bishop, Elizabeth A. Eaton. She writes:

"The ELCA's commitments call on us to denounce unequivocally any attacks—past, present or future—by any party that leads to civilians becoming victims. Our hearts are with all those who have been killed or injured, and with their families and friends. With an anticipated ground invasion, the most urgent need is for an immediate cease-fire to allow humanitarian aid to reach Gazans. Our advocacy as a church continues, guided by our long accompaniment of the Ev. Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and our commitments as a church to peace, justice, and ecumenical and interreligious dialogue and collaboration. In these days of continued grief and distress over the horrific attack by Hamas on Israelis and the largely indiscriminate Israeli military response affecting civilians in Gaza, we lament with all who mourn and live in fear. We believe that God is the one who makes 'wars to cease to the end of earth.' (Psalm 46:9)

It is our hope that the Muslims and Christians in the West Bank will continue to be largely spared the brutality in Gaza. Some of them are Lutheran Christians. One of them is a pastor in our own Florida-Bahamas Synod.

The prayers of some of our more conservation Christian brothers and sisters are only for Israel in the belief that Christ will not return to earth until the Temple Mount is under Israeli control. That kind of narrow-minded thinking is contrary to any efforts to bring about peace between Israel and the Palestinian lands. Unfortunately, many of the Israeli victims of the brutal attack on Oct. 6 were friends of Palestinians with whom they were working to advocate, peacefully, a two-state solution. The violence unleashed on Oct. 6 and the consequent deaths of thousands of innocent Palestinians caused by Israeli shelling will only deepen the resolve and hatred of thousands of young Palestinians who may survive the war. What can we do? We can send humanitarian help to both sides and we must pray, pray, pray for the peace now that will be the peace of that day when the lion shall lie down with the lamb."

We have much to think about as we approach our national day of Thanksgiving and the following season of Advent dedicated to preparing ourselves for His coming, His coming at Bethlehem, His coming into our hearts now, and His coming again upon the clouds of glory to fully consummate the kingdom to come.
