

Pastor's Message

FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR KEN

"Message from the Pastor"

In a few weeks, we will kick off the season of Lent with an Ash Wednesday Service at 5 p.m. on February 17.

Many Christians, in one way or another, celebrate the season of Lent. The origins of this pre-Easter season are not entirely clear but it seems that they have to do with a day-long fast before Easter (the Pascha) in the primitive church. Also, the early church began to assign the weeks before Easter as a time to prepare candidates for baptism, which took place on Saturday night.

Eventually, in the western church, the Lenten season became 40 days (excluding Sundays), the time that Jesus took to prepare himself, in the wilderness for his earthly ministry. By the fifth century, all Christians observed Lent by fasting, breaking away from sinful habits, focusing on virtues, giving alms, getting right with their neighbors, and forgiving those who had offended them. But rightly understood, Christianity has always insisted that the most important observance of Lent is one's preparation for the celebration of Easter.

In other words, Lent is a season dedicated to a happy ending. The solemnities of Lent have no meaning apart from the joy to which its days advance. Easter is the solution of a problem. The satisfaction that comes from the discovery of a solution cannot be savored without an appreciation for the riddle.

Lent's intention is to give the Christian the opportunity to reflect upon the problem. Most of the time, we call it sin. The New England Puritan primer put it this way, "In Adam's fall we sinned all." Honest folk will recognize their state of separation from that which we call God, and if we put much stock in the Bible, then it is separation from a loving, caring, merciful God.

The days of Lent are days to reflect upon our need to be nourished spiritually, our need to give instead of to take, our need to ask God for sustenance, our need to anticipate the joy of His victory over our pride, self-reliance, apathy and the relentless search for the good life. The operating principle here is the joy of giving, not the joy of taking. We do not **take** but we **receive** unmerited grace upon grace, what Paul calls the "abundance of grace." (Romans 4).

<u>COUNCIL KEY POINTS</u> JANUARY 2021 COUNCIL MEETING

Christ Lutheran Church (CLC) continues to function with a deficit budget. Our year to date (December 2020) figures showed approximately an \$11,000 deficit. A Stewardship Campaign is planned to take place by February 2021.

A New Member Orientation will take place on February 19, 2021, where Council Members and Team Ministry Leaders will be present to share an overview of their responsibilities. New members will be received during the service on February 21, 2021.

The Congregation Annual Meeting will be held on February 14, 2021 immediately following the service. Two new Council Members will be needed. Please consider taking an active part by serving on your church Council, which represents the congregation.

All functioning Team Ministries are hard at work planning community outreach projects and events to do "God's work with our hands," time and talents. The Worship and Music Ministry Team have made plans for meaningful services for the Easter season. Donation blue envelopes for Easter Lilies will soon be available in the pews.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE MINISTRY TEAM UPDATE

Congregational Care Lay Ministers (CCM) are still unable to do many home visits until the Pandemic CDC Guidelines are less restrictive. Pastor Lentz continues to do all communion visitations. Other than calls, or cards, CCM activities have remained limited throughout 2020.

The CCM's monthly "closed" meetings resumed January 2021. with an update on the remaining seven (7) "in home" congregants. Pastor Lentz announced the passing of **JOHN FAZEKAS** in November 2020. His ashes were placed with his beloved wife, Dawn's ashes in the CLC Memorial Garden on Monday, February 1, 2021. He will now also remain in the Lord's eternal care.

The CCM Ministry Team Charlene Seltz, Ursula Hiller, Kurt and Ines Kallmeyer, along with Pastor Lentz will now focus on a donation-structured event initiated by a very generous donation of the artistic talent of our belated member, **VERNON GUSTAFSON**, who went home to our God in December 2020. This event, titled "Healing Thru the Arts Fair" will be held on Sat. April 10, 2021, in the Fellowship Hall of Christ Lutheran Church. The 1st Planning Meeting followed where a list of potential artists, artisans and crafters was developed. More details will be available in February 2021.
