

FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR KEN

Message from the Pastor March 2021

We started our new bible study, "Path through Scripture," on Sunday, February 28. We've already had our first two sessions. We will have approximately 12 more sessions covering an overview of the Old Testament before beginning to embark upon an overview of the New Testament. Each session at 11 a.m. on Sunday will be repeated at 11:30 a.m. on Monday's. A textbook by Mark Link is being used in the class and used copies are available for a \$10 donation to the church. It is never too late to join the class since each session covers a section of the Old Testament independently from the previous sessions. I believe that this study is timely because of vast ignorance in our society about the Bible.

Few people, even Christians who regularly attend worship, have a working knowledge of the Bible. Our lessons address such questions as "Where did the Bible come from?," "When was it written?," "For whom was it written?," and "How is it relevant for today?"

Our first sessions, for example, revealed that the Old Testament has its origins in the oral traditions of the Jewish people who began to record in writing the history of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, the first patriarchs. The story of Abraham is about an ancient believer called by God to go forth from a place called Ur of the Chaldees to Haran, a place in northern modern Palestine from whence his God commanded him to go south to the land of Canaan, a land promised for all his generations to come "for all eternity." The story of the Jewish people began with Abraham's journey which the historians believe began about 1,900 B.C. His story was told for generations by the Hebrew people who conquered Canaan again, beginning in about 1,300 B.C. The people who wandered in the wilderness for 40 years crossed the Jordan River and "fit the battle of Jericho" and spread out to the north and the south claiming 12 areas of the promised land. They were governed by "judges" picked by God before finally becoming united into one land under the rule of kings Saul, David, and Solomon. It wasn't until David founded the new capital of the united land that priests at the new temple built by Solomon began to accumulate the various

historical accounts and began to write a comprehensive history of the Jewish people.

The traditions compiled by the learned scholars of Jerusalem were added to by the scholars in captivity in Babylon and more prophetic traditions were added until, finally, the Old Testament as we know it today was finalized by Greek speaking Jews in the diaspora in Alexandria, Egypt between 300 and 150 B.C. The Jewish scriptures in Greek were the scriptures known and read by the gospel writers. The compilation of the Jewish scriptures into one "volume" in Hebrew did not happen until 70 A.D. in a Palestinian location called Jamnia.

Come and learn more about the Old Testament in the coming weeks. Next Sunday (March 14), we will study the Creation accounts recorded in Genesis and compare those accounts with the results of scientific research about the origins of the universe. Did we all come from Adam and Eve? How long did it take God to create the world? Who is God? Where is God? What did Abraham and the patriarchs believe about God? How did their beliefs about God compare with what Jesus taught? Great questions. Come and consider some of the answers.

COUNCIL KEY POINTS FEBRUARY 2021 COUNCIL MEETING KEY POINTS

FINANCES: Approximately \$13,000 in offering envelopes and loose offerings were received in January 2021 with total expenses of approximately \$5,500. The 2021 Annual Budget has been increased to \$73,000. Christ Lutheran Church (CLC) needs to build up reserves.

STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY TEAM/COMMITTEE: A Stewardship Ministry Team/Committee is being developed. Pastor Robert Firby, Council Advisor, Jim Jung, Council Vice President, Barbara McAlister, Outgoing Council President and Financial Secretary, and Dick Krueger, Council Advisor, volunteered to be on this ministry team.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: The next Bible Study, "Path Thru Scripture," will begin on Sunday, February 28 at 11 a.m. and Monday, March 1 at 11:30 a.m. Text books are \$10 and will be available on the first day of class.

DISPLAY OF AMERICAN FLAG: After much discussion, a motion was made to display the American flag inside the church to the left of the altar (customary); and to raise the Christian flag on the highest flag pole and Lutheran flag on the lower flag pole outside the church. Motion carried with one abstain.
