Our RxAir360 team traveled to Houston and began talking and interviewing with prospects who will be added to our Medical Counsel. The team has also visited Electroimpact in Washington for the 1st physical look at our Hyperbaric Chamber prototype.

Great News

The design and construction have met FDA requirements. Last month, we told you we had to complete pressure testing for the chamber. We are pleased to announce the chamber has satisfactorily code-approved pressure tested for the entire chamber. This was the most difficult and a "BIG DEAL." The completion stage of the physical prototype is to start drilling mechanisms to insert all necessary parts to make the chamber function. Once this is completed and all parts functioning, it goes to the FDA10K company for pre-certification and then to the FDA for Approval.

What's Next

Now is the time for evaluations and pre-certification, so there will be no new information leading up to that point. We will consider all options for our financial literacy classes, which may start before the following newsletter in December.
