• **Completed model of the *Papegojan* on the cover of the latest Nautical Research Journal-Ken Lum**

We have all been following the construction of George Sloup's **Shipyard** paper model of the *Papegojan* (Parrot), a three-masted pinnace built by the Dutch in the early 17<sup>th</sup> Century. The original ship was purchased into the Swedish navy using her as part of a blockade of the Polish port of Danzig at that time.

An opposing fleet under the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth chased off the blockading Swedish fleet at the **Battle of Oliwa**, November 28, 1627 thereby relieving the blockade of that port.

I was pleased to find a cover photo in the latest NRJ of a completed paper *Papegojan* model identical to the one George is working on. Below is a copy of that cover (Fig. 3) along with a photo of George's model in progress (Fig. 4). There is also a fine article on paper models in the same issue that is worth reading.

**Shipyard** also has a paper kit of the *Schwarzer Rabe (Black Raven)* which is a similar ship also of Dutch construction but participated on the victorious Polish side at the Battle of Oliwa. More on that model in the November, 2020 Foghorn.

Clare Hess has announced some new kits now available from **Ages of Sail** in San Lorenzo. Here is a list that he provided at one of our recent meetings.

### •French Frigate *L'Hermione* 1779

**Disar Models** The scale is unclear. It is listed at 1/72. Wikipedia says the original ship was 145 ft. length. The modern French replica is listed at 213 ft. length. The advertised model length looks closer to 1/48 for 145 ft. and 1/72 for the 213 ft. length. Price: \$329.99

Model dimensions: Total Length 36.6" (930mm), Height 28.3" (720mm)

Frigate in the French navy built in 1778-79 in Rochefort. Participated in a number of actions against the British throughout her career. Most famous in America for transporting **Gilbert du Motier, Marquis de Lafayette** to serve in the American Continental Army during the American Revolution where he served with distinction. A full-size replica was built by the French in 2014 for ceremonial voyages.

•German battleship **Bismarck** 1939

Oh my Goodness! Another battleship **Bismarck!** This time it's a wood plank-on-frame model at a hefty size with superb detailing from **Amati** on the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of her sinking. Admittedly it's one of the more attractive modern warships contributing to its popularity.

- British 20 gun 6<sup>th</sup> rate ***HMS Sphinx*** 1775

Model dimensions: Length Overall – 797mm (31.4”), Hull Length – 604mm (23.8”), Height Overall-627mm (24.7”), Width Overall – 332mm (13”)

A charming example of one of the smaller patrol ships in the Royal Navy of the late 18<sup>th</sup> Century. While the original ship does not have a well-known history, this kit looks to be a real winner with exceptional detailing! That is definitely reflected in its high price.
