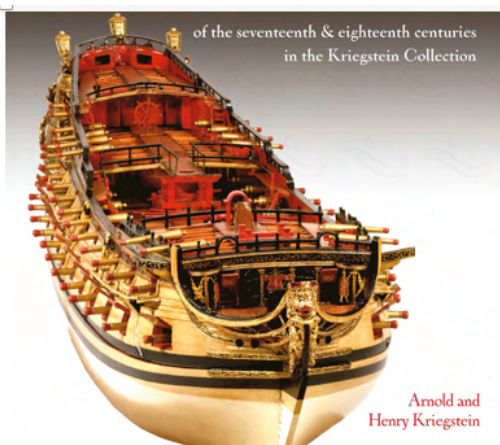


Fig. 2. Cover of “**Historic Ship Models**” by the Kriegstein brothers (Naval Institute Press).

They also have other items in their collection not listed in their book.

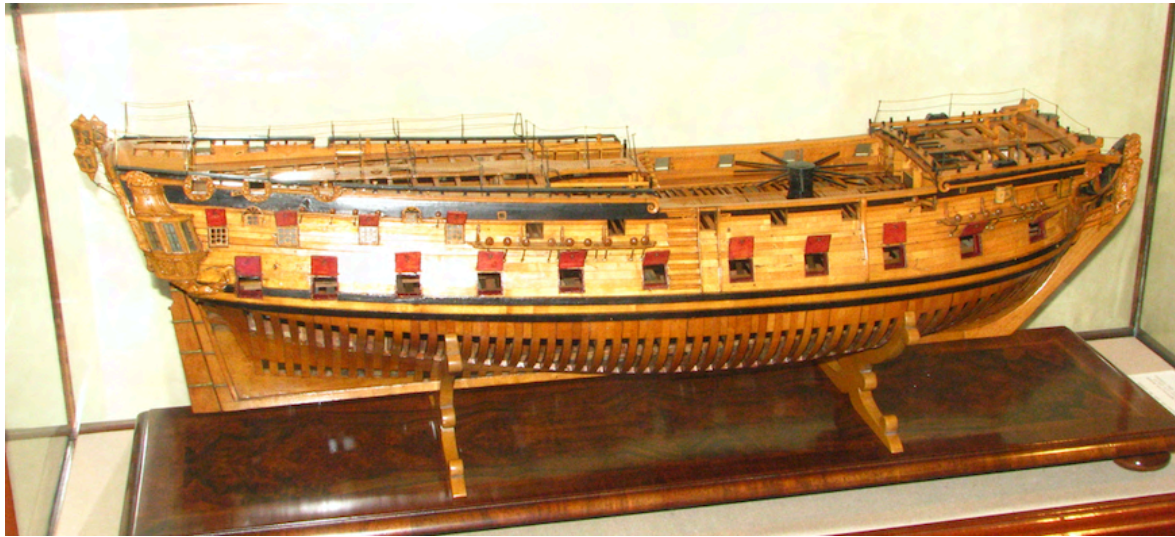


Fig. 3. Admiralty model of *HMS Diamond* (1708) in the Kriegstein house.

•**Video on the Ship Model Collection of Franklin Delano Roosevelt**

I did not know that FDR had a large ship model collection, and this video provides a brief tour of it (Fig. 5). It is part of the **Franklin D. Roosevelt Home** in Hyde Park, New York which is now part of the **National Park Service** and is open to the public.

Roosevelt's ancestors were involved in the shipping and ship building profession during the 19th Century. This background provided FDR with a strong interest in nautical and naval affairs. He also became an avid collector of nautical artifacts and art-including ship models. During WW 1, Roosevelt was appointed Assistant Secretary of the Navy during the Woodrow Wilson Administration and was responsible for building up the US Navy in preparation to enter that war.

The video says that his ship model collection includes over 400 models. Perhaps the most impressive is a 10 ft. long builder's model of

the ***SMS Emden*** (Fig. 6), a light cruiser in the German Kaiserliche Marine of World War 1.

. The model was found by General George S. Patton in the German Command Headquarters of the French City of **Metz** following the **Battle of Metz** in November, 1944. Patton had the model shipped back to FDR as a war prize.

More on this ship can be found in the **February-March, 2021 Foghorn** where there is an account of **Jacob Cohn** building a 1/350 Revell plastic model kit of this ship. And more on the rest of the collection is found in a blog link with the video below under “Show More”.

• **Black Pearl kit from ZHL is being offered by Model Expo. NRG recommends NOT to buy.** The Chinese ship model kit manufacturer, ZHL, has been accused of pirating the intellectual property of the ship model kits it sells. For that reason, the **Nautical Research Guild** has banned any mention of kits from ZHL on the **Model Ship World Forum** and from the **Nautical Research Journal**.

As it turns out the kit seller, **Model Expo**, is starting to offer ZHL kits for sale in its catalogue. The first such kit is of the fictional pirate ship, **Black Pearl**, from the **Pirates of the Caribbean** film series. The NRG is currently recommending to consumers **NOT** to purchase these kits so as to help protect the primacy of honest model kit designers.

Model Expo does sell other properly copyrighted kits such as the Model Shipways kits. The NRG sees no problem with buying these. With it being Halloween, **do not be tricked!**

Making fake water for ship model dioramas is a common modeling technique, and there are probably as many ways to do this as there are diorama builders. 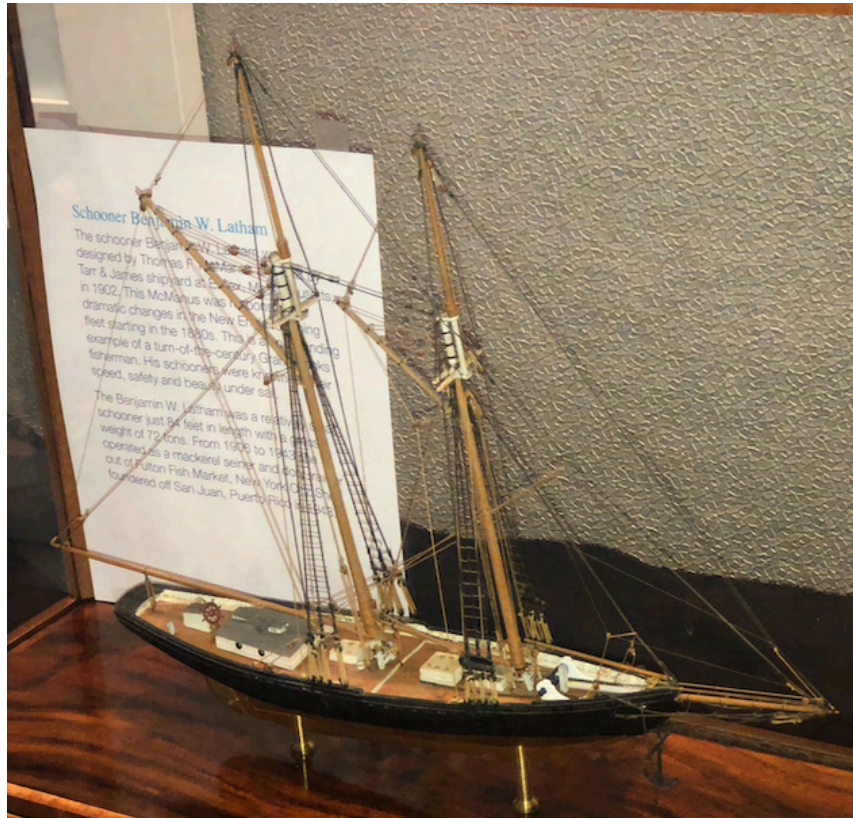


Fig. 11. Fishing schooner, *Benjamin W. Latham* model by Walter Hlavacek.

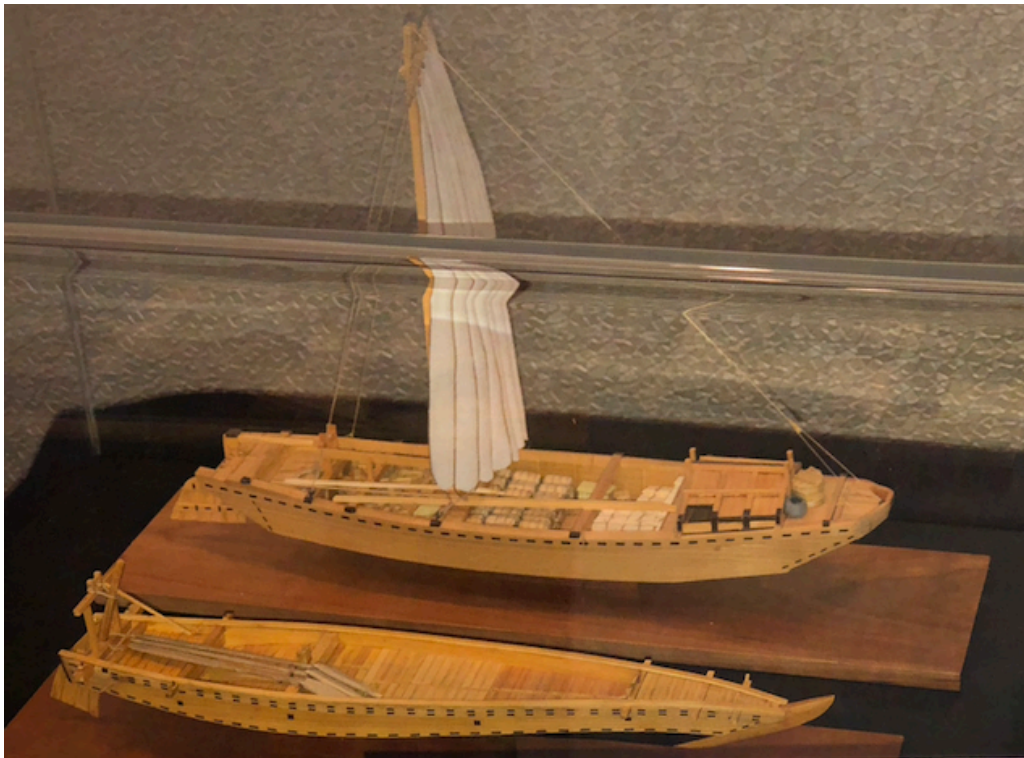


Fig. 13. Japanese river boats of the Edo period (1603-1867). Models by Clare Hess.
