Fig.1. The USS Olympia (C-6) is a protected cruiser built at the Union Iron Works in San Francisco 1891-2 and commissioned into the US Navy in 1895. She is best known as the flagship of Commodore George Dewey at the Battle of Manila Bay in the Philippines on May 1, 1898 when a fleet led by Dewey destroyed ships of the Spanish Navy stationed there during the Spanish-American War. The defeat led the US to assume governance of the Philippines until WW2. Over many years, the Olympia has escaped being scrapped and is now undergoing continuous maintenance to preserve her as a museum ship in Philadelphia, PA. (Jan's Cat, Wikipedia)

### • Saturday, June 15, 2024, 8:30AM PDT: Nautical Research Guild (NRG) Virtual Workshop. CREATING REALISTIC WORKING & FURLED SAILS by Ron Neilson & Tom Ruggiero.

This workshop will explain materials, techniques and tools for creating realistic-looking sails for ship models. The first presenter's section will focus on crafting working sails while the second presenter will explain techniques for creating furled ones. Both approaches use an inexpensive and adaptable paper-like material called "Silkspan." (The models shown in Fig. 3 are larger scale models so cloth sails were used.)

The Virtual Workshop is open only to NRG members via ZOOM on Saturday, June 15, 2024, at 8:30 AM PDT. If you are not an NRG member, by all means take this opportunity to join as the cost is very modest for this

# Marítíme Matters of the Month (Ken Lum)

• <u>L'Hermione Day in Palo Alto, May 19, 2024.</u> We had a terrific meeting with the French-American Cultural Society (FACS) at the Emerson Montessori School in Palo Alto to do a fund-raiser to help with repairs to an operating replica of the French frigate, *L'Hermione,* which is currently dry-docked at the Basque port of Bayonne. The original Hermione was built in 1779 and was most famously used to transport Gilbert du Motier, Marquis de Lafayette to America to participate in the American Revolution in 1780. Lafayette, as he is best known in the US, eventually led American troops during the last battle of the American Revolution at Yorktown in 1781 blocking the escape of British troops under General Cornwallis earning much notoriety.

The *Hermione* replica was built between 1997 to 2014 in the French port of **Rochefort** under the lead of **L'association Hermione-La Fayette** for purposes of tall ship tourism. Construction was done using wood shaped mostly with traditional wooden boat building techniques. Unfortunately, the ship was found to have a serious fungal infection of much of its wood during a maintenance inspection in 2021 rendering the ship not seaworthy. Now, as much as  $\in$  6.5 million needs to be raised to finish the repair work. We heard a Zoom meeting presentation at the Emerson School about these problems on May 19.

The SBMS and its members have donated several hundred dollars to this effort. In addition, we set up a ship model display during our meeting with the FACS showing several examples of late 18<sup>th</sup> Century French ship building in model form (Fig. 4 -8). We happily did this at the request of **Mr. Thomas Celerier** from the FACS when he met with us in January.




Fig.8. French carronade model in progress by Ken Lum derived from a Mantua kit with a scratch-built carriage built according to plans from Naval Artillery, French Navy, 1650-1850 by J. Boudriot and H. Berti (Ancre) 2015.
