One of the things I miss about where I grew up in New York is being near the ocean. I love to walk along the boardwalk and look out at the water. The water is so peaceful and yet powerful, on the same day, it can be completely still or a series of crashing waves. I see it as a metaphor for our lives.

During my lifetime I have seen events that can only be described as “churning waters”. But, with prayer, these raging waters always seem to yield to “calm and stillness”.

Water is a theme in our readings this weekend as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. We are invited to come, as we are, to the water and be made clean, to quench our thirst, and to be baptized into a new life with Christ. Perhaps now is a good time to recall our own baptism and the promises we made to reject Satan and all of his works and empty promises, to believe in the risen Christ, and to be drawn up from the water to the delight of the Father.

El agua es un tema en nuestras lecturas de este fin de semana al celebrar el Bautismo del Señor.
