Pastor's Message

Brothers & Sisters,

For several weeks we have been reading stories of John the Baptist preaching in the desert and trying to prepare people for the coming of the Lord. This week, Jesus literally walks by as John points to him and says "Behold, the Lamb of God". Andrew and his fellow disciple, encouraged by John, follow Jesus and want to know more about him. Andrew runs to get his brother, Simon Peter, takes him to meet Jesus and the rest is history. Actually, it's OUR story.

How did you come to be a follower of Jesus? Maybe a relative or a friend was your John the Baptist who pointed Jesus out to you. Maybe a neighbor or co-worker was your Andrew who brought you to meet Jesus. Maybe you did that for someone else as a parent, Godparent, sponsor, or catechist. When I was a student at the University of Utah, I was called by name to become more involved in my faith life by serving the community of Catholics at the Newman Center. I had no idea that setting up folding chairs would lead me to a lifelong journey of serving the Church as a Dominican priest.

On Monday, we celebrate the life of Martin Luther King Jr. who brought Jesus' message of freedom to us all, using nonviolent resistance to overcome injustice and helped change our nation for the better. I encourage you to
