Pastor's Message

Brothers and Sisters,

In today's Gospel, Jesus was recognized as someone who taught with authority. The word 'authority' has received some negative press in recent times. Various 'authority figures' have been criticized, often with good reason. Yet, in Jesus people experienced an authority that they found attractive, an authority that, in the words of the gospel, left them so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. Jesus was recognized as a person of authority because of the word that he spoke and the impact for good of that word on others. Ultimately, his authority was rooted in God, in the Spirit of God that descended upon him at his baptism. The power of God's love working through him gave him that authority that people found so attractive and so new.

For us as Christians, Jesus remains the ultimate authority. Like the people of Capernaum, we recognize his authority, the authority of his teaching and his deeds, the authority of his life, death, and resurrection. That is why we confess Jesus not just as our teacher but as our Lord. We are happy to submit to his authority, to his lordship, because we recognize that in doing so we will have a life to the full, and, like the man in the gospel, be freed of those spirits that prevent us from becoming the person God intends us to be. There can be great reluctance today to submit to anyone. The value of personal autonomy is highly prized and sought after. What matters is to submit to the right authority and today's gospel suggests that such authority is to be found in the person of Jesus.

Do we recognize the power of the love of God at work in one another? I invite you to spend some time this week reflecting on the voice of authority in your lives. Is it the voice of the evil one, perhaps your own voice, or do we truly submit to the ultimate authority, the will of God?

Mensaje del pastor

Hermanos y hermanas,

En el evangelio de hoy, Jesús fue reconocido como alguien que enseñó con autoridad. La palabra "autoridad" ha recibido una prensa negativa en los últimos tiempos. Se han criticado varias "figuras de autoridad", a menudo con buenas razones. Sin embargo, en Jesús, las personas experimentaron una autoridad que encontraron atractiva, una autoridad que, en las palabras del evangelio, los dejó tan asombrados que comenzaron a preguntarse unos a otros qué significaba todo eso. Jesús fue reconocido como una persona de autoridad debido a la palabra que habló y el impacto positivo de esa palabra en los demás. En última instancia, su autoridad estaba arraigada en Dios, en el Espíritu de Dios que descendió sobre él en su bautismo. El poder del amor de Dios obrando a través de él le dio esa autoridad que la gente encontraba tan atractiva y tan nueva.

Para nosotros como cristianos, Jesús sigue siendo la máxima autoridad. Como la gente de Capernaum, reconocemos su autoridad, la autoridad de su enseñanza y sus obras, la autoridad de su vida, muerte y resurrección. Por eso confesamos a Jesús no solo como nuestro maestro, sino como nuestro Señor. Estamos felices de someternos a su autoridad, a su señorío, porque reconocemos que al hacerlo tendremos una vida plena y, como el hombre en el evangelio, seremos libres de esos espíritus que nos impiden convertirnos en la persona. Dios quiere que seamos. Hoy en día puede haber una gran renuencia a someterse a cualquiera. El valor de la autonomía personal es muy apreciado y buscado. Lo que importa es someterse a la autoridad correcta y el evangelio de hoy sugiere que esa autoridad se encuentra en la persona de Jesús.

¿Reconocemos el poder del amor de Dios obrando unos en otros? Los invito a pasar algún tiempo esta semana reflexionando sobre la voz de la autoridad en sus vidas. ¿Es la voz del maligno, quizás tu propia voz, o realmente nos sometemos a la máxima autoridad, la voluntad de Dios?
