Pastor's Message

Brothers and Sisters,

As we “spring forward” our clocks this weekend to give us more daylight, the Church calendar also reminds us that the darkness of Lent will soon be over and we will turn our mourning into rejoicing.

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as Laetare Sunday. The day's theme comes from the entrance antiphon found in Isaiah 66:10-11: “Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.”

Laetare is the first word in the Latin text – meaning “rejoice”. On Laetare Sunday (as it does on the 3rd Sunday of Advent's Gaudete Sunday) the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances. It indicates a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we enter into the somber days of Passiontide.

Laetare Sunday is the Church's way of giving us a boost of encouragement as we approach the darkness and horror of the days through Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It's an opportunity to savor and keep in the back of our minds what awaits us on Easter Sunday – the reality that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, and that our hearts will always be filled with joy!

Mensaje del pastor

Hermanos y hermanas,

A medida que “adelantamos” nuestros relojes este fin de semana para darnos más luz del día, el calendario de la Iglesia también nos recuerda que la oscuridad de la Cuaresma pronto terminará y convertiremos nuestro duelo en regocijo.

El cuarto domingo de Cuaresma se conoce como domingo de Laetare. El tema del día proviene de la antífona de entrada que se encuentra en Isaías 66: 10-11: “Alégrate, Jerusalén y todos los que la aman. Alégrense todos los que estaban de luto; regocíjate y siéntete satisfecho de su pecho consolador ”.

Laetare es la primera palabra del texto latino, que significa "regocijarse". El domingo de Laetare (como lo hace el tercer domingo del domingo Gaudete de Adviento) la Iglesia expresa esperanza y alegría en medio de nuestros ayunos y penitencias de Cuaresma. Indica un atisbo de la alegría que nos espera en la Pascua, justo antes de entrar en los sombríos días de Passiontide.

El Domingo de Laetare es la forma que tiene la Iglesia de darnos un impulso de aliento a medida que nos acercamos a la oscuridad y el horror de los días hasta el Viernes Santo y el Sábado Santo. Es una oportunidad para saborear y recordar lo que nos espera el domingo de Pascua: ¡la realidad de que Jesucristo ha resucitado de entre los muertos y que nuestros corazones siempre estarán llenos de gozo!

Ser conscientes de las tradiciones y costumbres nos ayuda a celebrar la belleza de nuestra fe. Como puede ver, hay mucho asociado incluso con un día indescriptible como el cuarto domingo de Cuaresma, sin mencionar el resto de la temporada, o los 50 días de Pascua y más allá. Los animo a que se registren en la página de Facebook de nuestra parroquia y en el sitio web de nuestra parroquia para obtener información, educación y actualizaciones a medida que nos acercamos al Domingo de Ramos, la Semana Santa y la Pascua.
