HIGHLIGHTS FOR 2022:

- Additional prize money added -- \$9,000
- 9-Ball team – 2nd year - see details below
- 9-Ball and 10-Ball Singles - moved to Wednesday night at 7:00
- Jack & Jill Scotch Doubles – single elimination - pre-register or on-site signup
- A new player with no verifiable history cannot play as a Standard player in the team event
- No professional ranked players are allowed
- Separate Junior Guidelines for BEF Junior Tournament

QUALIFICATIONS:

A player must have played a minimum of four (4) full matches over a minimum of four weeks in one session of any ACS sanctioned pool league within Iowa or an Iowa border state since November 1, 2021. Credible and verifiable stats must accompany each entry. Misrepresentation of stats will be grounds for disqualification. A player must be in good standing with the National ACS Association at the time of qualification.

The League Operator must enter the entries into the MPA System and then forward ALL entries and fees by September 16, 2022, to Iowa ACS Treasurer, 3855 Raleigh Ave, Bettendorf, IA 52722. All league stats must accompany the entries if they are not in Compusport.

HOTEL RESERVATIONS:

To receive sponsorship and grant money for our tournament, we must generate an economic impact for the Quad Cities. The number of hotel room nights is a huge part of this. **Please reserve your room early at the DoubleTree by Hilton or at other nearby hotels.**

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS:

All pre-registered events are double elimination. World standardized rules apply. Rack your own with alternate breaks. Entries include green fees and administration fees. Absolutely no on-site entries will be accepted, except for Jack & Jill Scotch, 9-Ball Team, and 8-Ball Team 2nd Chance.

PAYMENT:

All pre-registered entries and fees must be submitted to your League Operator by, September 12, 2022. The League Operator will forward them to the Iowa ACS Treasurer. There will be a 5% processing fee for all credit card payments. NO REFUNDS!

A late fee of \$25 for singles and \$40 for teams will be applied after September 16th. Absolutely no entries will be accepted after **September 23rd.**

PLAYER STATUS and MPA RATING:

The three Singles Divisions are (1) Standard, (2) Open, which is handicapped by Open or Intermediate, and (3) Advanced, which is handicapped by Advanced, Master, or Elite. Handicapping the races in each Division has an effect on the Player Status within the Divisions as follows:

Standard	Standard	3	MPA definition OR an Open player who has not cashed in any other tournament (<i>Out-of-state players may be eligible if they played 2 of the last 5 years in IA ACS Open without cashing</i>)

If a player has no history in the Iowa ACS tournament, we will consider the ISPA and/or IOMA rating and history, as well as history at all other tournaments. Known ability should only be used when data is not available.

8-BALL TEAM:

The 8-ball team event is a 16-game format and consists of four players per team. There is one Men’s Division and one Women’s Division. Teams will be divided into four brackets based on total team handicap levels. The top four teams from each bracket will move to the Final Board. All teams on the Final Board are guaranteed prize money.

Any two base players from the same sanctioned league can form a team with any other ACS League players within the same state. The two base players must play every match. The League Operator of the base players will be responsible for verifying the qualifications of the players from another league.

Players are ranked according to their singles status, as noted above. They are handicapped as follows:

Elite	Elite	0	Elite Player
Master	M	4	Upper Master Player
Advanced	AA	8	Lower Master Player
Intermediate	A	12	Upper Open Player
Open	B	16	Open Player who cashed in another tournament
Standard	C	20	MPA definition OR an Open player who has not cashed

A new player without verifiable history may not play as Standard in the team event. If a team has more than four players, the team handicap is calculated on the four players starting that particular match. A team cannot substitute in another player after the start of the match if it would alter the handicap from the beginning of the match.

9-BALL TEAM:

9-Ball Teams consist of three players and do not need to be from the same ACS sanctioned league. The total team handicap cannot exceed 15, based on players' 8-ball singles rating. There will not be a separate women's division. Women may play at one level below their 8-ball rating. Races will be determined by each team's handicap. Entries are limited to 32 teams. This is a pre-registered event, but on-site entries will be accepted if openings are available. A player must be out of the 9-ball or 10-ball singles to participate in the team event. A player cannot play in both 9-Ball Team and Jack & Jill Scotch as these events are run concurrently. The 3-foul rule is not in effect.

JACK & JILL SCOTCH DOUBLES:

Jack & Jill Scotch teams consist of a female and a male player. Players do not need to be from the same ACS sanctioned league. Two Advanced Division (Advanced/Master/Elite) players cannot play together. This is a pre-registered event, but on-site entries will be accepted if openings are available. This event utilizes a 32-team bracket, and additional brackets will be added if entries exceed 32. A player must be out of the 9-ball or 10-ball singles to participate in this event. A player cannot play in both Jack & Jill Scotch and 9-Ball Team as these events are run concurrently.

SECOND CHANCE 8-BALL TEAM:

Must be eliminated from the regular team event without cashing and must have two members from the original team. Any added players must already be entered in the tournament. Players must be out of all other events. Teams may sign up on-site after elimination from the regular event. Team shirts are not required. The event is single elimination.

ADDITIONAL INFO:

- 9-Ball Singles – Standard and Open/Intermediate players only – NO Advanced/Master/Elite.
9-Ball Singles & Team – 9-ball on the break in any pocket is a win. The 3-foul rule is not in effect.
- 10-Ball Singles - Standard players are not eligible – Open/Intermediate will race to 5.
10-ball on the break is NOT a win.
- Cannot enter both 9-ball and 10-ball Singles as these events run concurrently.
Cannot enter both 9-Ball Team and Jack & Jill Scotch as these events run concurrently.
- Races in all events are subject to change depending on the number of entries.
- Team 2nd Chance is on-site registration – single elimination.
- Jack & Jill Scotch Doubles & 9-ball Team are pre-registered events. On-site registration is allowed, if there are openings available, at 10:00 a.m. Thurs. October 20.

MINI TOURNAMENTS:

Mini tournaments in all events will be held when tables are available and if time permits.

ACS NATIONAL TOURNAMENT:

The first and second place teams from both the Men's and Women's Divisions will receive free entry to the ACS National Tournament to be held in May 2023 in Las Vegas, NV.

EQUIPMENT:

7-foot Valley tables with red dot cue balls and Championship Mercury Ultra cloth. Tables will be open during competition and, when available, for practice.

The tournament room will be non-smoking throughout the championships.

DRESS CODE:

Your cooperation in wearing neat, clean apparel at all times during competition and practice for the betterment of the sport is appreciated.

- All players must wear sleeved shirts with a conventional fold-down collar.
- Tee shirts and sweatshirts are not allowed.
- Knee-length dress shorts are allowed. No athletic shorts are allowed.
- No torn or cut jeans.
- Appropriate warm-up suits, jogging suits, and leggings are allowed.
- Closed-toe shoes are required.
- Hats, caps, and visors must be worn forward.
- Earbuds, cell phones, etc., are not permitted.
- Team shirts are **required** for all 8-ball teams during the team competition. An event shirt may be worn in place of a team shirt.
