Ballot Issue 10

1% Earned Income Tax

Does not tax retirement, social security, disability or capital gains income



1 Mill property tax reduction for all homeowners

The Board approved legislation that requires an Annual Property Tax Review. If cash balance thresholds are met, additional property tax reductions shall occur in the future.

Why does Kings need an Operating Levy Now?

Kings needs additional local revenue to account for:

- State foundation funding was less in 2025 than in 2024
- Property tax levies do not grow as home values increase (HB920)
- Increased inflationary costs
- Increasing enrollment- 886 additional students since 2015

2 Options:

- 1. Operating levy request in November 2025 or
- 2. Make Significant Personnel, Student Program, and Service Reductions

The 1% Income Tax will generate an est. \$12,506,636 in the first year.

The 1 Mill Property Tax Reduction will give \$1,533,870 back to the community through lower property tax bills.

Net revenue generation of \$10,972,766 in the first year.

A 6.9 Mill property tax levy would generate \$10,583,702.

Provides funding for the duration of the five-year forecast without the need for another levy request during that period and potentially longer.

This plan is a start to property tax reform and potential property tax reductions in the future Kings Local School District.

Est. \$8,270,000 in revenue generation or cost savings have been achieved

When will the earned income tax and property tax reduction become effective if approved?

• January 1, 2026

How long would the millage reduction be in effect?

 If approved, the millage reduction would be permanent as long as the earned income tax is in place

2025 Earned Income Tax and Property Tax Reduction Why is approximately \$9 Million necessary?

- 1. Balance the budget for 2026-2027
- 2. Maintain the district's limited cash reserves (savings account)

Reductions effective for 2026-27 school year

\$9M is a 1 year fix. Additional reductions would be needed in the future without additional revenue as costs continue to rise to balance the budget.

2025 Earned Income Tax and Property Tax Reduction Impact if it Doesn't Pass: *Transportation Reductions*

CURRENT OPERATIONS

- Students in grades K-12 are bussed each day by Petermann Transportation.
- Also bus to private and parochial schools.

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$1,300,000 million reduction

- Shift towards a state minimum transportation model.
- Eliminate busing for grades 9-12 including private high schools and Autism/JP Scholarship students
- Implement 2 mile walk zones for K-8.

State Minimum Transportation Reduction - \$1.30 Million

- No Busing for grades 9-12 or private HS
- Walk Zones for grades K-8
 - Reduced buses for JFB, SLE, KME, CIS, JH
 - Example: 4 buses at JFB- currently 14
- Total Students not eligible for bussing =
 2,662 (55% of K-12 students)

2025 Earned Income Tax and Property Tax Reduction Impact if it Doesn't Pass Student Participation and Technology Fees

CURRENT OPERATIONS

- Currently there is not a district pay to participate fee for athletics, clubs, and activities.
- A wide variety of opportunities in athletics, academics, and artistic clubs and activities.
- District provides Chromebooks and technology software.

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$1,237,500 revenue generation

- KHS and KJH athletes will pay up to \$625 per sport.
- Implement participation fees for academic and musical/artistic extra curriculars.
- Reduce amount of teams, clubs, activities.
- Increase student fees to support devices and software needs.

2025 Earned Income Tax and Property Tax Reduction Impact if it Doesn't Pass Facility Rental Fee

CURRENT OPERATIONS

- Currently charge non-school sponsored organizations the cost for a custodial fee for use of facilities.
- Outside organizations are charged a rental fee based on the facility use form.

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$50,000 revenue generation

- Facility Use Agreement will be modified and apply to any non-school sponsored individual or group utilizing our facilities.
- Fees cover the entire cost to staff and maintain the district's facilities.
- Would apply to: Scouts, KBA, KYV, Soccer shots, Arts, etc.

2025 Earned Income Tax and Property Tax Reduction Impact if it Doesn't Pass Custodial Services

CURRENT OPERATIONS

 Utilizing in-house and Alpha and Omega custodial services to provide daily cleaning to classrooms and facilities throughout the district.

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$100,000 reduction

- Reduce the cleaning model in the classrooms and buildings.
- Increase outsource opportunities

2025 Earned Income Tax and Property Tax Reduction Impact if it Doesn't Pass Support Staff Reductions

CURRENT OPERATIONS

- Cafeteria/recess aides
- Instructional coaches focus on providing support, resources, and leadership for teachers
- Technology support positions
- Administrative positions supporting buildings, operations, athletics and student programming
- Beech Acres mental health therapy support in each building
- Nurses in each building
- ESL population of 719 students
- School Counselor at each K-12 building

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$1,275,000 reduction

- Reduce cafeteria/recess aide positions
- Reduction of Instructional Coach positions
- Reduce technology support position
- Reduce administrative and administrative assistant positions
- Elimination of Beech Acres mental health therapy support in each building
- Reduction of a Nursing position
- Reduction of a TESOL position
- Reduction of a Counseling position

2025 Earned Income Tax and Property Tax Reduction Impact if it Doesn't Pass Safety Reduction

CURRENT OPERATIONS

- 4 School Resource Officers covering seven buildings
- 2 Campus Security personnel at KHS
- GoGuardian- tool that monitors students safety on district devices 24/7.

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$275,000 reduction

- Reduce 1 School Resource officer
 positions will have 3 SRO's covering
 7 buildings
- Eliminate Campus Security positions at KHS
- Eliminate GoGuardian

Positions/Programs Impacts

Reductions in programs and services that will change the student experience.

2025 Earned Income Tax and Property Tax Reduction Impact if it Doesn't Pass Preschool, Childcare and Summer Camp

CURRENT OPERATIONS

- Special Education Preschool is required by law
- Offer childcare for PK students in the am or pm and before/after care for K-6
- Kings Kids Summer Camp services students each summer

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$112,500 reduction

- Eliminate Before/After School Care
- Eliminate Kings Kids Summer Camp
- Eliminate Preschool Childcare
- Reduce Preschool Position

K-6 Reductions

Reduction of Full Day Kindergarten

CURRENT OPERATIONS

 Full day Kindergarten program for 356 students, including opportunities for specials classes.

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$600,000 reduction

- Move from a full day program to a half day program.
- No specials for half day Kindergarten students.

K-12 Reductions

Increase class sizes

CURRENT OPERATIONS

- Grades 1-4: average 23.8 students per class
- Grades 5-6: average 26.0 students per class
- Grades 7-8: average 25 students per class
- KHS- 26-30 varies by course

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$1,800,000 reduction

- Grades 1-6: Increase class sizes to 28-30/class.
- Grades 7-8: increase to 30/class.
- Grades 9-12: Increase class sizes to 30 in core classes in KHS and possibly higher in elective courses.

K-12 Reductions

Special Education

CURRENT OPERATIONS

- 665 Kings students on an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) are served by 48.5 Intervention Specialists and 88 paras
- 3 Social Communication Classrooms K-12
- Transition Coordinator for KHS is 2 days a week
- Job Coach for KHS is 4 days a week
- Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) 3 days a week

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$475,000 reduction

- Increase caseloads for intervention specialists reduction of Intervention Specialist positions
- Eliminate Social Communication Programs
- Transition Coordinator reduced to 1 day a week paid by a grant
- Job Coach reduced to 1 day a week paid by a grant
- Eliminate BCBA

K-6 Reductions

Reduction of Specials/Enrichment

CURRENT OPERATIONS

- Specials opportunities in PE, Art,
 Music, Stem, and Media Center
- At K-6 buildings there are reading teachers, reading tutors, and TESOL teachers.
- In grades 4-6 there is gifted instruction.

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$950,000 reduction

- Reduction of offerings and frequency of specials classes
- Reduction of Gifted instruction and support
- Reduction of Reading tutor positions

7-12 Reductions

KJH Course Offerings

CURRENT OPERATIONS

- Kings Junior High operates on an academic team approach.
- Kings Junior High offers a variety of elective courses including those for high school credit, and classes that give students opportunities to explore passions and interests.

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$375,000 reduction

- Eliminate academic teaming structure and move to a traditional Junior High schedule.
- Reduction of elective options.
- Eliminate HS credit course offerings for 8th grade
- Eliminate Intervention Quest Program

7-12 Reductions

KHS Course Offerings

CURRENT OPERATIONS

- Kings High School provides
 opportunities for students to
 experience learning through a wide
 variety of coursework that prepares
 students for college and career.
- Currently require 23 credits for graduation.

LEVY FAILURE IMPACT

\$450,000 reduction

- Move towards a state minimum of 20 credits for graduation.
- Reduce positions in each content area impacting elective offerings, including 10 AP courses, advanced courses and courses valuable on transcripts.
- Limits student ability to graduate with an Honors Diploma

2025 Earned Income Tax and Property Tax Reduction

What if the Levy Fails

Without new revenue, approx. \$9 million in cuts will need to be made impacting the following programs:

- Transportation \$1.3M
- Student Participation & Activity Fees \$1.2375M
- Facility Rental \$50k
- Custodial \$100k
- Support Staff \$1.275M
- Safety \$275k
- Preschool, Childcare, Kings Kids Summer Camp \$112.5K
- Kindergarten \$600k
- Class Size Increases \$1.8M
- Special Education \$475k
- K-6 Specials & Enrichments \$950k
- KJH Course Offerings \$375k
- KHS Course Offerings \$450k



With a reduction of approx. 125 positions including childcare, custodial, safety personnel, teachers, administrators, support positions and program reductions resulting in class size increases, the following must be considered:

Restructure the district to consolidate space to achieve greater cost savings by reducing the number of school buildings in operation.

Additional Considerations:

- Redrawing of school boundary lines
- Closing inefficient building(s)
- Elimination of neighborhood schools
- Grade level buildings
