

Our impact:

The burden of lupus on daily life can be devastating. 65% of people with lupus say chronic pain is the most difficult part of having lupus, 76% of lupus patients say fatigue caused by lupus has forced them to cut back on social activities, 89% of people with lupus say they can no longer work full-time due to lupus complications.

The National Resource Center on Lupus provides information and support for anyone affected by lupus, including people diagnosed with lupus, children and teens, caregivers, health care professionals and the public. The Resource Center aims to empower, educate and connect through trustworthy, reliable and high-quality resources that provide emotional support and clear, accurate health information.

The LFA provides answers to questions and gives caring support to people with lupus and their loved ones. Money raised is used to support lupus research, education and advocacy programs that serve to improve the quality of life for all people with lupus.
