Cleaning products, paints/solvents, batteries, aerosols, petroleum products (gasoline, motor oil/oil filters) refrigerators, air conditioning units, antifreeze, herbicides, pesticides, tires, and heavy metals such as tire rims & basketball hoops.

Tvs/Monitors, computers, and type of electronics or any potentially hazardous materials.

A HISTORY LESSON



Stanley Hotel

In 1903 Freelan Oscar Stanley arrived in the Estes Valley. Freelan was very weak and underweight from symptoms of consumption. After one season his health was restored, and he vowed to come back every year. Freelan was from the east coast and loved the sophistication. So, the stylish Stanley hotel was built. In 1909 the first guest arrived in a Stanley designed steam car. By the 1970's the hotels popularity faded due to lack of care and investments. It might have been torn down if it wasn't for a well know author Stephen King. Just one night was enough to inspire his third major work and first hardcover bestseller The Shining.

CODE ENFORCEMENT CODE COMPLIANCE

- **Sec. 7-5-20. - Control of animals.**

All animals shall be kept under control. No owner, harborer, keeper or other person who has assumed responsibility for any animal shall allow such animal to run at large within the Town. If any animal is found at any place within the Town other than upon the premises of the owner, the owner is presumed to have violated this Section.

A dog shall be considered running at large when it is neither on the premises of its owner nor on a leash ten feet or less in length attached to the dog and held by or tied to a person.

All other animals are prohibited except as set forth in [Section 7-5-10](#) above.

Animals may be prohibited in parks or other public places when signs stating the same are erected at reasonable places indicating such prohibition.
