March 15, 1965- Lyndon B. Johnson urges the passage of voting rights for all.


March 21, 1965- Martin Luther King Jr begins historic march in Alabama.



A HISTORY LESSON



Rocky Mountain National Park

In 1909 Enos Mills of Estes Park who spent all his life there was a naturalist, nature guide, and lodge owner wanted to create the nation's tenth national park. Enos wrote thousands of letters and articles lobbying Congress to create a new park. On January 26, 1915 Woodrow Wilson signed the Rocky Mountain National Park Act. It was then dedicated September 4.

The park is 415 square miles or 265,807 acres. It ranges in elevation from 7,860 feet to 14, 259 feet on top of Longs Peak.

Rock Mountain National Park is home to more than 60 species of mammals more than 280 bird species and 11 specials of fish.

CODE ENFORCEMENT CODE COMPLIANCE

Sec. 7-5-200. - Keeping of poultry; limitations and requirements.

The keeping of male poultry, as defined in <u>Section 16-1-40</u> of the Pierce Municipal Code, is prohibited upon any parcel of land within the Town. The keeping of more than eight female poultry, as defined in <u>Section 16-1-40</u> of the Pierce Municipal Code, is prohibited upon any parcel of land within the Town. However, up to eight female poultry may be kept per parcel of property, subject to the following requirements and subject to all other applicable provisions of this Article:

- (1) All structures devoted to the keeping of female poultry shall be located between the rear-most portion of the residence and the rear lot line of the parcel in question. No female poultry shall be permitted within any other portion of the lot or parcel.
- (2) If a parcel has more than one dwelling unit, all adult residents and the owners of the parcel must consent in writing to allowing the female poultry on the property.
- (3) Any person keeping female poultry pursuant to this Section must first have been issued a permit by the Town, the application for which shall be made available by the Town Clerk, and shall expressly incorporate an acknowledgement of the provisions of <u>Section 7-5-20</u> above. The Town Clerk shall assess an application fee in an amount set forth in the Town Fee Schedule for each application received under this Article.
- (4) All female poultry must be provided with a covered, predator-resistant poultry house that is properly ventilated, designed to be easily accessed, cleaned and maintained and at least two square feet per poultry in size, and no portion of which shall exceed six feet from grade.
- (5) During daylight hours, the female poultry must have access to the poultry house, must have access to adequate fresh water and must also have access to an enclosure that is screened on all sides and on top and adequate to protect them from predators.
- (6) The female poultry must be protected from predators by being closed in the poultry house from dusk until dawn.
- (7) Neither the poultry house nor any portion of the outdoor enclosure may be located less than 15 feet from any abutting property line unless the owner or keeper of the female poultry obtains the written consent of the owners of all abutting properties to which the enclosure is proposed to be more closely located; in which event, the agreed upon location shall then be deemed acceptable to all such abutting property.
