Duncanville Community Theatre

Founded in 1988 by Amy Jackson—who still serves as Executive Director—the Duncanville Community Theatre has been a vibrant part of our town for decades. Heather Winkelman joined the team in 2012 and became Associate Director in 2024, helping lead the theatre into its next creative chapter.

Each year, the theatre produces six dynamic shows and hosts summer workshops for children and teens. These two-week camps culminate in a lively performance that's always well-attended and warmly received. Camps are affordably priced, and scholarships are available for families needing financial assistance. If your child is interested but cost is a concern, just reach out—the staff is happy to help!

Before each production, auditions are held—and everyone is welcome to try out! Cast members range from the mom down the street to seasoned actors with BFAs in theatre. Even one of our City Council members has taken on a small role, proving the stage is truly open to all.
