Spotlight on Christmas Bazaar donations

The Duncanville Women's Club donates proceeds from our Christmas Bazaar to several non-profit organizations. This year, we will spotlight each organization and share how your contributions are being utilized. Our first spotlight is on Property Improvement Program, to which we donated \$600 in 2024.

Property Improvement Program (PIP)

The Property Improvement Program (PIP) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that was originally started at First Methodist Church of Duncanville. Since its inception in Spring 2016, PIP has worked on 78 properties.

Twice a year, in Spring and Fall, four to six properties in need of external repairs in Duncanville are selected. The properties are chosen by the PIP Board based on homeowner applications and visual inspections to determine if PIP can assist. These homeowners are unable to make the repairs themselves due to health, financial, or other life circumstances. Typically, the applicants are long-term homeowners on fixed incomes who cannot keep up with repairs. They take great pride in the homes they've lived in for many years. PIP has been able to lift this burden for these homeowners and help beautify neighborhoods. PIP volunteers find it encouraging to drive by homes they have worked on in the past and see them still nicely maintained. In some cases, the city has referred homeowners to this program to assist them in meeting code or safety issues.

Some examples of the work being done include repairing siding and eaves, replacing or repairing fences, painting, trimming trees, and replacing doors.

PIP covers all material costs and provides volunteer labor. Volunteers donate their time for two consecutive weekends to complete the project. They come from local churches, civic organizations, and the City, and the program is open to anyone who would like to help, whether you're a Duncanville resident or not.

During the two weekends, volunteers can help as much or as little as they want, with no experience or special skills needed. Any set of hands is welcome. Volunteers have ranged in age from teens to those in their 80's. The City of Duncanville provides trash pickup through Republic Services and portable restrooms for volunteers. All City permit fees are waived.
