To All Interested Persons and parents,

The Austin County Fair Calf Scramble Program is a great program for those who have an interest in beef cattle. This program is designed to help and assist youth in Austin County with a beef project that may not have an opportunity to raise beef cattle except through this program. There are a lot of learning experiences involved with the program and we want every eligible child to have an opportunity to participate. If you are interested but have a limited knowledge of showing cattle, we have numerous individuals on the calf scramble committee who have a tremendous amount of experience that are there to help you from start to finish.

The application, essay, and **notarized** minor's release must be completed and turned into the fair office, county extension office, Ag science teacher or the calf scramble committee by **September 16, 2019**. <u>Late applications will not be accepted</u>. Attached is a set of rules with which you must comply with prior to competing. Please make sure you are familiar with <u>ALL</u> rules before completing an application to participate in this event. It is a very extensive program with many benefits but we ask that you review the rules before getting into the program. This event involves more than just simply feeding an animal. A complete set of rules can be obtained from the Austin County Fair Office, Agricultural Extension Office, Ag Science Teacher or the Scramble Committee. Also please be aware of the physical and financial aspects of this event. We look forward to your participation in the Calf Scramble. If there are any questions regarding the Calf Scramble program or the application, you may contact one of the chairmen at the below numbers.

#### NEW CHANGES MADE IN 2015:

- PURCHASING The beef heifer to be purchased with the certificate MAY BE a purebred or full-blood or any breed recognized by any Texas Major Stock Show. The beef heifer may also include any beef breed or cross eligible to enter the Austin Co Fair Halter heifer show and divided into two (2) breed divisions: American and All other breed. Any halter heifer (non-registered or commercial) must be tagged/ entered in the Austin Co Fair Halter heifer show at Major Stock Shows.
- Heifers will be shown by their division. Divisions will consist of Registered heifers: American, British and Exotics and Halter heifers Commercial heifers: American & AOB (AOB). Any halter (commercial / cross) heifer must be tagged in as a Austin Co Fair halter heifer to be eligible for halter heifer division
- Halter heifer (non-registered or commercial) must be tagged with the option of entering in the Austin Co Fair Halter heifer show. Scramble / Halter heifers are eligible and must be exhibited in the Austin Co Fair Halter heifer show and eligible for Youth Auction sale. Halter heifers must meet ALL requirements of the Austin Co Fair Halter heifer show to remain eligible to compete in the Scramble show.

Each applicant must attend an Informational meeting on September 18, 2019 at 6:00 pm at the Austin County Fairgrounds.

## AUSTIN COUNTY FAIR CALF SCRAMBLE RULES AND REGULATIONS PRIOR TO 2019 CALF SCRAMBLE

- ELIGIBILITY Any boy or girl who has reached his or her 12<sup>th</sup> birthday by or on September 1, 2019 and has not exceeded his or her junior year in high school. The boy or girl must reside in Austin County or be enrolled in a public school district; private school or home schooled in Austin County <u>AND</u> also be enrolled in a 4-H Club or FFA Chapter in Austin County.
- PARTICIPANT APPLICATIONS Application for participation MUST be submitted by interested persons to: Austin County Fair Office at P.O. Box 141, Bellville, TX 77418 or Austin County Extension Office. <u>1 East Main St.</u>, Bellville, TX 77418. <u>All applications for participation are DUE ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 16, 2019</u>. The Scramble Committee reserves the right to determine the number of calves, number of participants, and awards to be given on the basis of committed sponsorships.
- <u>3.</u> MINOR'S RELEASE A completed and notarized minor's release <u>MUST</u> be submitted along with the application. An incomplete minor's release <u>WILL NOT</u> be accepted. All information must be complete and the form must contain the signature of both parents. However, one signature will be sufficient in the event the parents are divorced or if one parent is deceased. It must be noted if one of the above situations applies. <u>THE APPLICATION FOR PARTICIPATION WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT A COMPLETED AND NOTARIZED MINOR'S RELEASE.</u>

Applications, minor's releases and essay forms may be obtained from the Austin County Fair Office, County Extension office, Ag Science Teachers or the Scramble Committee. Participants may apply as many times as desired but will be ineligible to participate once he or she has been awarded two certificates to purchase an Austin County Fair Scramble Heifer.

- 4. SELECTION OF PARTICIPANTS Participants will be selected on the basis of adequate facilities, availability of resources and desire to raise and show a registered beef heifer. The selection process will also include the review of a written or typed essay. The essay will be required to contain information regarding the above mentioned special requirements.
- 5. A calf scramble agreement form MUST be completed prior to the scramble. At least one parent/legal guardian and the participant will be required to sign the agreement and have their signatures notarized. The forms and notary will be available at the sponsor reception hosted on Saturday evening of the fair.
- 6. LIABILITY The Austin County Fair Association of the State of Texas and any person associated with the Calf Scramble Committee will not be held liable for any accidents, which may occur to any participants of the Calf Scramble, before, during or after this event.

THINGS TO THINK ABOUT: A calf can be purchased as early as August 1, 2019. It can be purchased from a breeder, relative or out of your herd. If you catch you will be awarded a \$1000.00 calf scramble certificate on the night of the scramble. Refer to the current Livestock Catalog for more details.

Please familiarize yourself and understand what is required of you both physically and financially should you enter into this program. ## INFORMATION TO HELP YOU UNDERSTAND THE TIME AND FINANCIAL COMMITMENT NEEDED IF YOU CATCH AND RECEIVE A SCRAMBLE HEIFER:

### Costs are ranges or averages and can vary:

Heifer - most will pay \$1,000-\$5,000 - Average cost is \$2,500

Feed - \$90 - \$250 per month - Obviously the older and bigger the calf gets the more they will eat.

Hay - \$35 - \$70 per month

Hoof Trimming \$40/hoof trimming - Recommend at least twice. Once around 6-12 months of age and 3-6 weeks before the show

Clipping: \$40 - \$100 Need to have them clipped prior to any show you attend and must be clipped for the pictures taken at the progress show in August, if you don't have a professional backdrop picture available.

Blower (Mainly for haired heifers) - \$400

Show Halter - \$35

Everyday Rope Halter - \$4

Neck Tie - \$6

Show stick - \$20

Rice Root Brush - \$20

Scotch Comb - \$20

Show box - \$50 - \$800

Pooper Scooper - \$20

Feed Pan - \$13

Water Bucket - \$13

Typical Day at the barn working with your heifer:

Catch the heifer – 1 min

Tie her up and love and pet her for 5-15 minutes -5-15 min

Rinse her – 15 min

Brush her – 15 min

If haired animal – blow her dry with a blower (mega size hair dryer) - 30 min

(Haired animals are your British and Exotic breeds – Non-Haired animals are your American influenced breeds)

Work feet – 10-15 min

Walk her – 10-15 min

Leave her standing another 2 hours (once she is halter broke and gentle)

You should work your heifer 3-7 times a week taking about 30 min  $-1\frac{1}{2}$  hours each time to work her.

## BE SURE AND CONTACT YOUR AG TEACHER OR COUNTY AGENT AS THEY MAY BE ABLE TO HELP YOU SELECT A CALF, CLIP, OR HOOF TRIM FOR A REDUCED COST OR EVEN FOR FREE.
