RULES:

1. All Agricultural Mechanics Projects are subject to the Austin County Fair Association General Rules and Regulations.

2. An entry fee of \$25.00 will be charged per project entered. The entry deadline is Monday, September 29, 2025, at 5:00 p.m. Please mail your entries to the:

- 3. Entries are limited to FFA, 4H, and SkillsUSA members residing in and/or attending school in Austin County.
- 4. Projects exhibited must have been constructed, fabricated, or reconditioned by the exhibitor.
- 5. A project can be exhibited only one time at the Austin County Fair and must have been constructed, fabricated, or reconditioned within one year of the exhibition date.
- 6. All projects must be clean, painted or treated and in a presentable condition even though they may have been used.
- 7. A working plan, blueprint or drawing, photographs showing construction and a bill of materials are required to be submitted with each project entered. Description of service performed and before and after photos required for reconditioned projects.
- 8. Projects may have been individually, or group constructed.
- 9. Any project that does not fit into one of the stated divisions will be disqualified by the Committee.
- 10. All projects are to be identified with standard club exhibitor cards provided by the Fair.
- 11. Projects may be exhibited outdoors.

- 12. The exhibitor/exhibitors must be present during the judging to meet and discuss their project with the judges.
- 13. Every precaution will be taken to protect the project entered; however, neither the Austin County Fair Association nor officials of this committee will be responsible for any losses or damage to projects.
- 14. Projects will be judged on the following:

A. Workmanship

B. Design & Materials Used

C. Practicality

D. Degree of Difficulty

E. Finish

- 15. Exhibitor agrees to abide by all Rules and Regulations of the Austin County Fair, including but not limited to the Release of Liability & Indemnity and Drug Certification Agreement, which spells out "Zero Tolerance" policy as well as the penalties associated with violation of these rules. All these rules are found in the 2025 Livestock Rule Book (page 15) which can be obtained at the Fair office, the Extension office, or from an FFA teacher or online at www.austincountyfair.com.
- 16. The 2025 Austin County Fair Ag Mechanics show will be divided into two shows: Selling and Non-Selling. The exhibitor will make the determination as to which show they would like to enter when completing the entry form.
- 17. Each show will have a Grand Champion and a Reserve Champion.
- 18. The Division Champions (6) in the selling show will sell in the Youth Supreme and Country Auction sale on Saturday, October 11, 2025. Exhibitors will be present during the auction while their project is being sold.
- 19. Exhibitors in the Ag Mech Selling Show can only sell one (1) project in the Youth Supreme and Country Auction. This does not affect the Youth Auction Livestock Sale.
- 20. General rules for the Youth Supreme and Country Auction can be found in the Home Economics Rule Book.
- 21. A project completed by multiple exhibitors and selling in the Youth Supreme and Country Auction will have their auction monies divided equally among the exhibitors. This does not affect Add-On monies which are given individually.
- 22. Chapter projects are not eligible for the Selling Show.

DIVISIONS:

1. Agricultural Machinery and Equipment:

Hay Equipment; Spraying Equipment; Mounted and Pull-Type Tractor Equipment; Hydraulic Equipment; Shop Equipment; Truck, Tractor and Agricultural Equipment or Accessories.

2. Electrical Equipment:

Show and Livestock Equipment, Shop Tools, and Equipment

3. Livestock Handling Equipment:

Gates and Panels; Squeeze Chutes and Restraining Equipment; Trim Chutes, Blocking Stands, Livestock Crates; Head Gates; Feeders; Other Livestock Equipment

4. Trailer:

Small Utility; Small Stock; Utility and Implement Trailers; Stock Trailers; Multi-Bale Trailers

5. Home Convenience/Recreation:

Barbecue Pits/Grills; Picnic Tables; Swings; Wood Racks; Furniture/Wood Projects; Projects for Horticultural Use; Wildlife Equipment

6. Reconditioned/Refurbished:

Tractors; Small Engines/Lawn Mower; Agriculture Equipment; Trailers
