

2024 Austin County Fair

Lil' Wrangler Rodeo Rules

Saturday, October 12th, 2024 Event- 2:00 pm In the Big Red Livestock Barn Ages: 3-4 yrs., 5-6 yrs., 7-8 yrs.



- Overall Champion in each age group.
 - The lowest total of all scores added up will receive a Little Wranglers Champion buckle.
- ❖ 1st place of each event Buckle
- ❖ 2nd place of each event Plague
- 3rd place of each event Rope
- ❖ Best Dressed cowboy/cowgirl in each age group will get 3 seconds/points knocked off overall score.

Stick Horse Racing: (3-4 yrs. Old and 5-6 yrs. Old)

- 1. This will be a timed event.
- 2. In the 3-4 yrs. old group, the contestants will go from the starting line, around one barrel and then back to the finish line.
- 3. In the 5-6 yrs. old Start at the starting line and complete the clover leaf pattern and come back across the starting line.
- 4. If a contestant breaks the pattern a 5 second penalty will be added.
- 5. If need be, a tiebreaker will be held.
- 6. Fastest time wins.
- 7. The Rodeo judge's time is final.

Calf Ribbon Pulling: (3-4 yrs. Old)

- 1. This event will be done on foot.
- 2. This is a timed event.
- 3. The contestant will run from the starting line, pull a ribbon from calf, and return to the starting line.
- 4. One contestant will go at a time.
- 5. If need be, a tiebreaker will be held.
- 6. Fastest time wins.
- 7. The Rodeo judge's time is final.

Calf Mopping: (3-4 yrs. Old and 5-6 yrs. Old)

- 1. The contestant will start at the starting line, run to the mop bucket, run and mop the calf, return mop to the bucket and run back to starting line.
- 2. This is a timed event, and the judges time is Final.
- 3. If there is a tie, there will be a rerun for the tiebreaker.
- 4. The clock will start when the contestant takes off running.
- 5. 3-4- and 5–6-year-olds will do the same exact event
- 2. Fastest time wins.
- 3. The Rodeo judge's decision is final.

Feed the Horses: (5-6 yrs. Old)

- 1. Feed bags will be placed on the start line, and panels down the arena.
- 2. Contestants will fill one feeder then return to the feed bag to fill the second bucket.
- 3. Must have scoop in each bucket and make two trips.
- 4. Once the second bucket is filled with one scoop, the contestant will run across the start line.
- 5. This will be a timed event.
- 6. Tiebreaker will be held need be.
- 7. The fastest time wins.
- 8. The Rodeo judge's decision is final.

Saddle Race: (5-6 yrs. Old)

- 1. A saddle will be placed down the area with a stand.
- 2. An empty stand will be placed at the starting line.
- 3. Contestant must start at the starting line, go get saddle and carry it to the stand at the starting line.
- 4. 2 contestants will run at the same time.
- 5. This is a timed event.
- 6. Tiebreaker will be held need be.
- 7. The fastest time wins.
- 8. The Rodeo judge's time is final.

Dummy Roping: (7-8 yrs. Old)

- 1. Contestants will have three opportunities to try and rope a dummy.
- 2. Only head catches will count.
- 3. Contestant must stand behind barrier line for loop to count.
- 4. Catch = 0 points added
- 5. Miss = 1 point added
- 6. Each loop can help or hurt your score.
- 7. The lowest score will win the event.
- 8. Tiebreaker will consist of two tries to rope the dummy (most catches wins).

Hay Hauling: (7-8 yrs. Old)

- 1. Each contestant will start at the designated start and finish line.
- 2. Contestants must pull the wagon from the start line to the stack of hay, load 3 bales of hay, and then pull the hay back to the finish line. Once the wagon crosses the finish line, the hay must be unloaded off the wagon.
- 3. The timer will stop when the last bale touches the ground.
- 4. This is a timed event.
- 5. Fastest time wins.
- 6. If need be, a tiebreaker will be held.
- 7. The Rodeo judge's decision is final.

Steer Wrestling: (7-8 yrs. Old)

- 1. Contestants will run from the starting line to steer and knock it over.
- 2. Once that is complete, the contestant must run back across the designated start line.
- 3. Clock will stop when the contestant crosses the starting line.
- 4. This is a timed event.
- 5. Fastest time wins.
- 6. The Rodeo judge's decision is final.
