



Due to safety concerns about residents parking on the street, Gwinnett County will be placing to Parking on Street signs throughout our subdivision. This is a safety issue blocking visibility of oncoming traffic. Aside from safety concerns and HOA regulation, it's also county and state law. Sec. 110-63. Parking not to obstruct traffic. (Code 1978, § 8-4004).

Expect to see the No Parking signs within 90 days.

If you have an event of course is ok, but street parking is not permitted on a day-to-day basis. As a courtesy please notify your neighbor when/if you have an event.

On Thursday A county officer will come to talk to us about different code enforcements and how to create and maintain a safe and healthy community for everyone. Bring your chair to the Cul-De-Sac by 215 Twin Brook Way.

/	If your answer is D, you are correct. Garbage Cans/Recycle bins must be maintained only in the rear
	yard concealed from view by neighbors (Article VI-6.14).

3. Approximately what percentage of home owners pay their HOA dues?

A. 99% B. 80% C. 70% D. 60%

✓ **If your answer is D, you are correct.** For the other 40%, please pay your balance or set up a payment plan before June 30th 20018. Every home owner is automatically a member with rights to vote (Article III-3.03) and obligation to pay HOA dues which is \$50.00 annually (Article IV-4.01(a)).
