The weekly curbside pickup program continues year round on a Monday (except for changes noted on the calendar), weather permitting. All yard waste, including leaves, must be bagged in paper yard waste bags, or placed in reusable yard waste bags or it will be left at the curb. You may also place small bundles of branches that can be picked up by one person without falling apart. IF YOU HAVE MORE THEN 3 BUNDLES OF BRANCHES FOR PICKUP PLEASE CALL THE BOROUGH OFFICE TO ARRANGE PICKUP. **WEIGHT LIMIT FOR BAGS IS 25 POUNDS.** You must call and leave a voice message or text message, by 9 AM Monday for pickup that day. When you leave a message or text, please state the following:

Street address and number of bags and/ or bundles for pickup.

DO NOT PLACE YOUR BAGS CURBSIDE UNTIL THE MORNING OF PICKUP.



In January, Christmas trees, with ALL decorations including lights must be removed, may be placed at the curb for pickup. DO NOT place Christmas trees or yard waste out for trash pickup, it is not part of the Borough trash contract. Please Remember that if pickup is canceled for a winter weather event (snow or ice), DO NOT leave it at the curb.

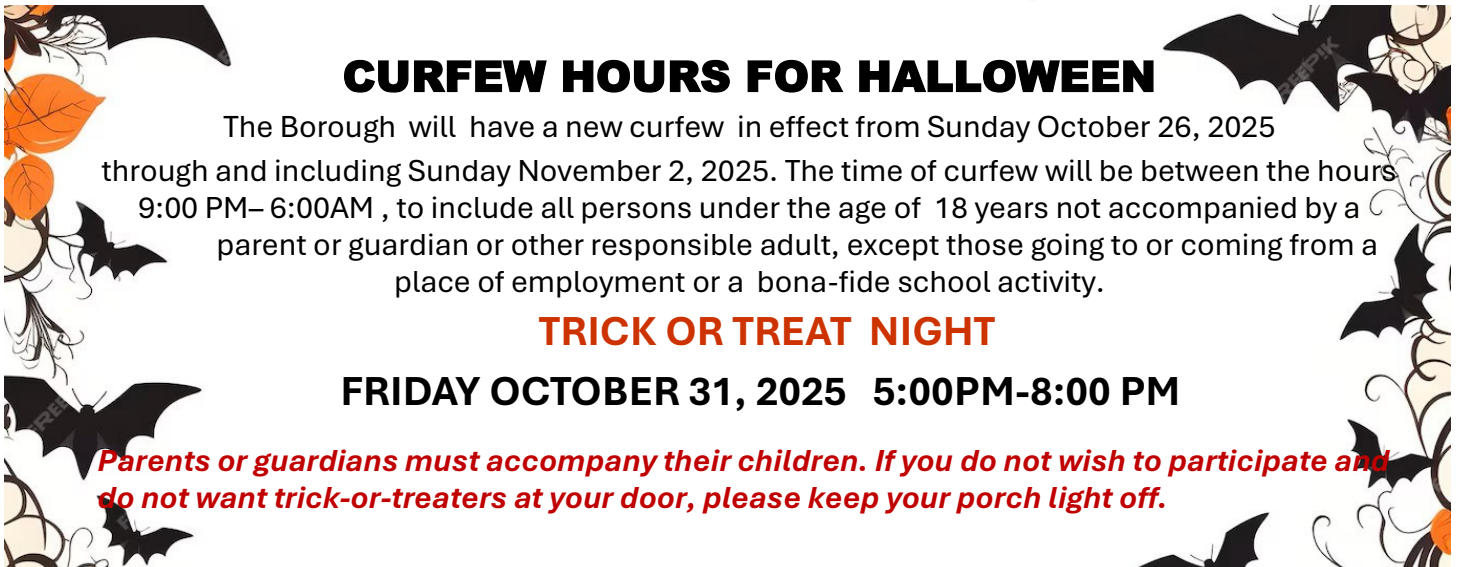
CURFEW HOURS FOR HALLOWEEN

The Borough will have a new curfew in effect from Sunday October 26, 2025 through and including Sunday November 2, 2025. The time of curfew will be between the hours 9:00 PM– 6:00AM, to include all persons under the age of 18 years not accompanied by a parent or guardian or other responsible adult, except those going to or coming from a place of employment or a bona-fide school activity.

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PERMITS AND INSPECTIONS

If you are asking yourself if you need a permit, the answer is **YES**.

Permits are required from changing your bathtub to adding an addition to your house. A **UCC or Uniform Construction Code Permit** is required if you intend to construct, enlarge, move, demolish, or change any part of a building, Residential or Commercial. Plumbing/ Mechanical and Electrical permits are included in this

Roof: Permit

New kitchen: Permit

Any decking above 30 inches
needs a permit.

Siding: Permit

New bathroom: Permit

Additions: Permit

New porch: Permit

All these plus much more require permits. Believe it or not, in the State of Pennsylvania swimming pools, no matter the size also require a permit. They also need to be 4ft above ground or have a fence, which requires a permit!



Zoning Permits are different then UCC Permits. Zoning permits can go along with a UCC permit or they can stand alone. These permits are required when there is a change in use, expansion, or addition to the property or residence. Residential or Commercial.

Fences

Pools

Sheds



Driveways

Additions

Garages

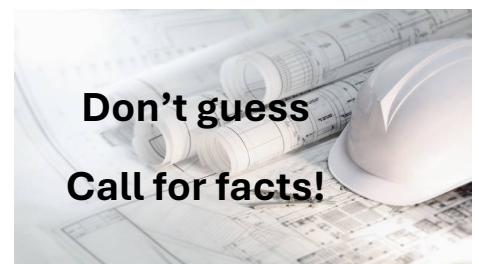

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Centennial Corner : The Incredible History of St. Lawrence 1927-2027

On April 27, 2027, Saint Lawrence Borough will commemorate its centennial anniversary. Our charming little town's origins trace back to an era when stagecoaches traversed the Old Philadelphia Pike or meandered along the Oley Turnpike Road. A favored way station was the Black Bear Inn, strategically positioned at the confluence of both thoroughfares. Both roads had the distinction of being trolley routes. This quaint hamlet also straddles the border of Exeter and Mt. Penn.

Before any development, approximately one thousand acres were under the stewardship of the Levan family. This expanse was subsequently subdivided to establish a village. The community boasted tanneries, gristmills, a hat factory, a substantial dairy enterprise, and the Brumbach Woolen Mills. Additionally, there were churches, Behm Butcher Shop, Barber Shop, Adams General Store, a glue factory, and John F. Lutz Furniture and Casket Factor and many more.

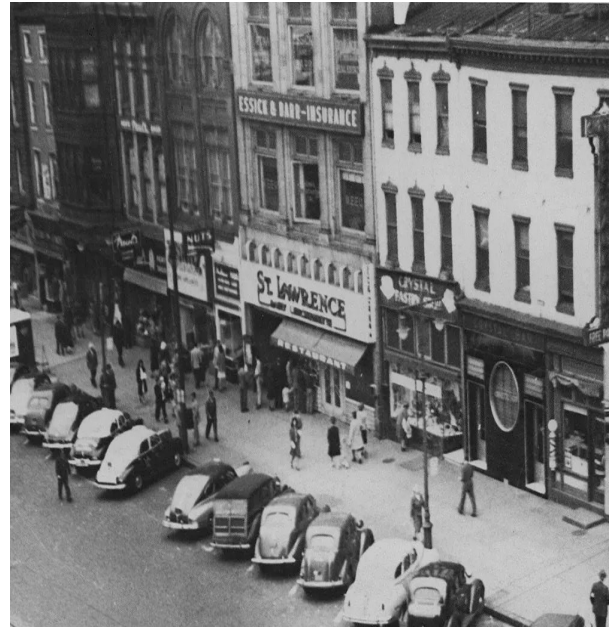
During this era, individuals would gather in front of the historic Black Bear Inn, eagerly anticipating the arrival of a letter or package. (site of European Motors)

In due course, the proprietor, Frank Esterly, consented to receive mail on behalf of the townsfolk, thus giving rise to the Esterly Post Office. This pivotal development contributed to the identity of the surrounding area, which began to be referred to as "Esterly."

This small community began to take shape; the A. J. Brumbach Woolen Mill garnered considerable acclaim for its exceptional St. Lawrence Brand Grade of Wool and Textiles. This is how we were distinguished by the name: "St. Lawrence."

The highly traveled Oley Turnpike was the last privately owned thoroughfare in Pennsylvania. It experienced a significant increase in traffic. This route extends from the Black Bear Inn to Pleasantville. In response to the incessant passing of horses and carriages, residents were compelled to fence and wall in their front lawns to mitigate the formation of deep ruts. Unfortunately, pedestrians were left to navigate the unpaved streets. The pressing necessity for sidewalks and roads ignited a movement to establish a local government, culminating in the separation of St. Lawrence from Exeter Township and its subsequent incorporation as a borough.

Today, we take pride in our healthy population of 1,892 residents, and we oversee 5.19 miles of road, with 2.40 miles designated as state roads. Our community is served by the St. Lawrence Woman's Club, Exeter School District, the Lower Alsace Ambulance, and the Exeter and Mt. Penn Fire Departments. We operate under our own local government, which is composed of a seven-member board, a borough manager, a secretary, a dedicated road crew, and a mayor. 2025 Pennsylvania Municipal Election Information

Tuesday, October 21, 2025	County Deadline to Begin Distribution of Civilian Absentee and Mail-In Ballots	As soon as possible after ballots are printed and in no event later than this day, the county boards of elections must begin to deliver or mail all civilian absentee and mail-in ballots.
Monday, October 27, 2025	Deadline for Disabled Elector to Apply for Need for Assistance on Registration (Municipal)	Last day before the November election on which an elector, who has suffered a physical disability which requires him/her to have assistance in voting, may personally make application to the county registration commission in all counties to have such fact entered on his/her registration card.
Monday, October 27, 2025	Deadline to Appeal Rejection of Voter Registration to County Board of Election (Municipal)	Last day for any person to file a petition with the county registration commission appealing rejection of a voter registration application.
Tuesday, October 28, 2025	Deadline to Apply for a Civilian Absentee Ballot (Municipal)	Last day before the municipal election on which official applications for civilian absentee ballots from certain persons listed as follows may be received by the county boards of elections, due at 5:00 PM.
Tuesday, October 28, 2025	Deadline to Apply for a Mail-In Ballot (Municipal)	Last day before the November election on which official applications for mail-in ballots may be received by the county boards of elections, due at 5:00 PM.
Tuesday, October 28, 2025	County Deadline to Post the Military, Veterans and Emergency Civilian Absentee Voters' List (Municipal)	From this day and until the returns are certified, the county boards of elections shall post the Military, Veterans and Emergency Civilian Absentee Voters' list.
Monday, November 3, 2025	Deadline to Appeal Rejection of Voter Registration to the Court of Common Pleas (Municipal)	Last day for any person to file an appeal to the Court of Common Pleas for rejection of registration.
Monday, November 3, 2025	Deadline for UMOVA Voters to Submit Absentee Ballot (Municipal)	Not later than 11:59 PM this day, covered voters under UMOVA must submit their voted military-overseas ballot for mailing or other authorized means of delivery, at the place where the voter completes the ballot on the date immediately preceding the date of the election.
Tuesday, November 4, 2025	Municipal Election	Municipal Election. Polls shall remain open continuously between the hours of 7:00 AM and 8:00 PM.
Wednesday, November 5, 2025	County Deadline to Report Election Night Returns	By 3:00 AM on this day, the county boards of elections must submit to the Department of State returns received from the judges of election for each office for which a candidate must file a nomination petition with the Secretary of the Commonwealth.
Thursday, December 4, 2025	County Deadline to Report District Level Vote Totals (Municipal)	Last day for each county board of elections to submit to the Bureau of Elections a report stating the total number of votes cast in each voting district for each candidate for any Statewide Office, United States Representative, State Senator and State Representative.

CURBSIDE BRUSH & LEAF Information and Requirements

1. Yard waste must be in a paper recycle bag OR a reusable yard bag. Plastic trash bags will be left at the curb and must be removed promptly.
2. **PLEASE LIMIT THE WEIGHT OF BAG TO 25 LBS.**
3. Only vegetative yard waste may be placed in the recycle bag. If there are any issues - you will receive a door tag that states the problem. Any repeated violations of bag content will result in being permanently removed from the pickup list.
4. Bundled branches 6' in length or less and able to be picked up by one person AND NOT FALL APART. Limit of 3 bundles OR limbs without prior authorization from the Borough.
5. Excessive quantities will not be picked up without prior approval.
6. **DO NOT PLACE ANY BAGS, BUNDLES, OR ANY OTHER VEGETATION IN THE STREET**

TROUT RUN BRUSH DEPOSITORY

The Trout Run Brush Depository is a joint project of Exeter Township and the Borough and managed by the Township Highway Crew. The facility, located at the intersection of W. Neversink and E. Neversink Roads, accepts brush, grass clippings and Christmas trees only, delivered by the Property Owner. The facility is monitored by cameras 24/7 and entry/exit requires an access card to open the gate. There is a \$25 annual fee for an access card and are available by application at the Exeter Township Municipal Building. There is a limit of one card per household and proof of residency or ownership is required. If Access card is lost or stolen, please notify EXETER TOWNSHIP and the card will be deactivated. To replace a card, the fee is \$25 and the previously issued card will be deactivated.

Landscaping companies doing work on residents' properties are not permitted to use Trout Run. Dumping construction debris or trash of any kind is expressly prohibited and carries a fine of up to \$600 per offense.
