WHEREAS, the Borough of St. Lawrence, in Berks County, plans to undertake sidewalk connectivity, curbs, and pedestrian safety improvements, including ADA ramp installations and replacements, a project totaling \$ 1,519,336.00. This amount reflects changes and added modifications to the original planned project.

WHEREAS, the Borough of St. Lawrence is requesting a grant from the Commonwealth Financing Authority for the PA Multimodal Transportation Fund to be used for the placement of sidewalks, curbs, and pedestrian improvements, including ADA installations and replacements along St. Lawrence Ave. and N.
