
NEW EMS TAX TO BE ENACTED FOR 2024

The weekly curbside pickup program continues year round on a Monday (except for changes noted on the calendar), weather permitting. All yard waste, including leaves, must be bagged in paper yard waste bags, or placed in reusable plastic yard waste bags (pictured) or it will be left at the curb. You may also place small bundles of branches that can be picked up by one person without falling apart. IF YOU HAVE MORE THAN 3 BUNDLES OF BRANCHES FOR PICKUP PLEASE CALL THE BOROUGH OFFICE TO ARRANGE PICKUP. WEIGHT LIMIT FOR BAGS - 25 POUNDS.

You must call and leave a voice or text message, by 9 AM Monday for pickup that day. When you leave or text a message, please state the following: street address and number of bags and/ or bundles for pickup. **DO NOT PLACE YOUR BAGS CURBSIDE UNTIL THE MORNING OF PICKUP.** In January, Christmas trees, with all decorations including lights removed, may be placed at the curb for pickup. **DO NOT** place Christmas trees or yard waste out for trash pickup, it is not part of the Borough contract. Remember that pickup is cancelled for winter weather events (snow & ice), do not leave yard waste at the curb.

NO BURNING OF LEAVES OR BRUSH ALLOWED IN THE BOROUGH - ORDINANCE #450 DETAILS THE HOMEOWNER'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE USE OF CHIMINEAS, FIRE PITS, ETC.

The Ordinance has rules for the use, location and responsibility of the homeowner for small open fires. Only agricultural properties within the Borough are allowed to open burn brush with a permit. Homeowners may burn a fire contained in a Small Open Fire receptacle, no more than three feet in diameter or length, that burns charcoal, natural gas, or other clean-burning fuels, such as dry and clean logs, twigs, or other wood products. A cover must be used that doesn't permit stray sparks and hot embers to fly around.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- * A RESPONSIBLE ADULT MUST BE PRESENT AT THE FIRE AT ALL TIMES FROM IGNITION THROUGH EXTINQUISHMENT
- * MUST HAVE ADEQUATE MEANS PRESENT TO EXTINQUISH FIRE , FLAMES MAY NOT EXCEED TWO FEET IN HEIGHT
- * NO BURNING OF TRASH, RECYCLABLE MATERIALS, PLASTICS. ALSO, NO EXCESSIVE SMOKE, ODOR OR MALODORUS EMISSIONS
- * MUST BE TEN FEET FROM STRUCTURE, ROADWAY, PROPERTY LINE, UTILITY, TREE OR OTHER COMBUSTIBLE MATERIALS



COLOR CODES USED BY THE UTILITY COMPANIES, MUNICIPAL AUTHORITIES AND MUNICIPALITIES TO MARK UNDER-GROUND LITHITIES

Do I have to call if I am digging on my own property?

Yes, you are required to inform the utilities of any type of work involving the movement of earth with **powered equipment**.

Who should make the call?

The person who is doing the digging should place the one call notification. If you are a homeowner and you've hired an excavator to do the work, the excavator is required by law to call to have lines located (refer to Section 5 of PA Act 287).

How deep must I dig before I am required to call?

If you are digging with powered equipment the person operating the equipment must call. It does not matter how deep you are digging or where you are digging within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

What are PA One Call's hours of operations?

The call center is open 24-hours a day, 7 days a week, every day of the year.

How many days do I have to wait before I can begin digging?

State law requires a three (3) business day notice (does not include state holidays or weekends), but not more than ten (10) business days prior to the start of excavation. A business day begins at 12:00:00 a.m. and ends at 11:59:59 p.m. The first lawful start date for your excavation is determined by your scheduled excavation date (the day you plan to start digging), work should not begin prior to your first lawful start date but no later than 10 business days from the day of your call.

Why should you call?

Safe digging is no accident! If you are installing a fence or deck, or digging for a mailbox post, patio or other excavation project, it is important to KNOW WHAT'S BELOW.

WHAT HAPPENS TO UNPAID SCHOOL PER CAPITA TAX BILLS

The Per Capita (head tax) bill was mailed at the same time as the School real estate tax bills. In November, the School District will mail out reminder notices. If you receive a notice, your tax is not paid. The closeout of Per Capita taxes occurs May 31, 2024.

The School District turns over unpaid Per Capita taxes to Statewide Tax Recovery LLC.

Did you know that cooking fires are the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries? Cooking safety starts with YOU. PARTICLE PRESENTION WEEK* Pay attention to fire prevention.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK IS OCTOBER 8th - 14th

"COOK WITH CAUTION"

- Be on alert! If you are sleep or have consumed alcohol don't use the stove or stove top.
- Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, boiling, grilling, or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove.
- If you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you that you are cooking.
- Keep anything that can catch fire oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains - away from your stovetop.

If you have a small grease cooking fire and decide to fight the fire...

- On the stovetop, smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled.
- For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed.

If you have any doubt about fighting a small fire...

- Just get out! When you leave, close the door behind you to help contain the fire.
- Call 9-1-1

Smoke alarms save lives. They are a key part of a home fire escape plan. When there is a fire, smoke spreads fast. Working smoke alarms give you early warning so you and your family can get outside quickly. Install smoke alarms inside and outside each bedroom and sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home, including the basement and attic.

- ♦ Large homes may need extra smoke alarms.
- It is best to use interconnected smoke alarms. When one smoke alarm sounds they all sound.
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month. Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working
- There are two kinds of alarms. Ionization smoke alarms are quicker to warn about flaming fires. Photoelectric alarms are quicker to warn about smoldering fires. It is best to use both types of alarms in the home.
- A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall. Keep smoke alarms away from the kitchen to reduce false alarms. They should be at least 10 feet from the stove.
- People who are hard-of-hearing or deaf can use special alarms. These alarms have strobe lights and bed shakers.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.
- ♦ ESCAPE planning for all ages. Plan for your abilities, making a home fire escape plan for yourself and/or the older adults in your household. Reduce the risk of trips/falls by reducing clutter to provide a clear safe path out of your home. Make sure all windows and doors open and that walkers or wheelchairs fit through doorways. Keep eyeglasses, mobile phones and a flashlight by your bed/where you sleep. Make sure your flashlights are in operating condition.

UNDER 18 CURFEW HOURS EXTENDED FOR HALLOWEEN

Council extends, by Resolution, the normal curfew time (Midnight to 5:00 AM, official prevailing time) to **9 PM to 6 AM, official prevailing time, from October 21**st **until November 4**th. All minors under the age of 18 may not be out upon any of



the streets, alleys, parks or public places during the curfew unless accompanied by a parent or person charged with control after an event or activity, traveling to or from an event or activity or going to or from work. If you have any questions, contact the Borough office.

TRICK OR TREAT NIGHTS - OCTOBER 30th & 31st - 5 PM TO 8 PM

The Borough asks that a parent, guardian or responsible adult accompany children during the Halloween Trick or Treat
Nights. If kids are on their own, remember the curfew. **Those willing to have Trick or Treaters stop by, please turn on**your outside lights. Those who are trick or treating, please do not stop at a home with no exterior lights turned on.



EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

The Borough uses the Code Red System to notify residents and businesses about emergencies and general notifications, such as trash pickup changes.

If you are signed up, please verify that all your contact information is correct. If you have made any changes to you email, cell number and/or landline, it must be changed or removed from the CodeRed system.

If you are new to the Borough please sign up for notifications with CodeRed. Access the CodeRed system through the link on the home page of the Borough website @ www.stlawboro.us . CodeRed will be used for emergency notifications (snow emergency, etc.) and general notifications (trash day change). Any questions, please contact the Boro Office.

If you no longer wish to receive calls, texts or emails and/or are moving out of the Borough, please call the Borough Office and provide all your contact information so we may add it to the DO NOT CONTACT list.

This is the quickest method we have for contacting the Borough residents in Case of Emergency. We avoid making excessive contacts.

TRIM YOUR TREES AND OVERGROWN BUSHES

Low hanging trees over streets and sidewalks, along with bushes growing over the sidewalk hinder the safe passage of pedestrians and vehicles. Pedestrians need to duck for low hanging branches or walk in the street because of overgrowth. Lack of visibility of regulatory sign, such as speed limit and stop signs, can cause accidents.

Trees limbs need to be trimmed to 14' above a street and 8' above a sidewalk OR 5' from roadway. All

Trees limbs need to be trimmed to 14' above a street and 8' above a sidewalk OR 5' from roadway. All bushes must be trimmed to prevent any portion from hanging over a sidewalk or the street. It is the property owners responsibility to keep their trees and bushes trimmed.

The Borough will place Courtesy hang tags on the front doors of properties that have violations. The hang tag will state what is in violation and the amount of time to correct the violation. The use of hang tags seek voluntary compliance in addressing these safety issues; but begins the enforcement process. If the violation remains uncorrected, a Notice of Violation will be sent requiring compliance, along with stating the consequences of failing to comply.

In the winter, the weight of ice and snow cause low hanging limbs to droop further. In addition to vehicle and pedestrian safety, without the removal of overgrowth along streets and hanging limbs, vehicle parking and snow plowing becomes more difficult.

To replace a card, the fee is \$15 and the previously issued card will be deactivated.

Landscaping companies doing work on residents' properties are not permitted to use Trout Run. Dumping construction debris or trash of any kind is expressly prohibited and carries a fine of up to \$600 per offense.
