BOROUGH PROPERTY TAX RATES INCREASE FOR 2022 GENERAL FUND PROPERTY TAX 7.00 MILS * FIRE TAX .68 MILS

On a home assessed at \$100,000 the Borough property taxes would be \$700 for the general fund and \$68 for the fire tax for a total of \$768. The Fire Tax may only be used on expenditures related to providing Fire Protection (fire hydrants, 911 fees for dispatching fire service, payments to Exeter Township Volunteer Fire Company & Mt. Penn Fire Company)

Here are a few important fire safety tips every family member should know:

- 1. Have a fire emergency plan to vacate if necessary.
- 2. Never leave candles burning in an unattended room.
- 3. Lighted candles do not belon on greeneries or trees.
- 4. Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant.
- 5. Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. DO NOT OVER-LOAD EXTENSION CORDS.
- 6. Test vour smoke alarms.
- 7. Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop.
- 8. Before heading to bed blow out lit candles and turn off all light strings and decorations. As always - be well and safe

ICE & SNOW TAKE IT SLOW SAFETY AROUND SNOW PLOWS



First Snow or Ice – Drivers usually aren't prepared for winter driving and forget to take it slow. Remember to drive well below the posted speed limit and leave plenty of room between vehicles. **Black Ice** – Roads that seem dry may actually be slippery and dangerous. Take it slow when approaching intersections, off-ramps, bridges or shady areas. All are hot spots for black ice.

Limited Visibility – Stay attentive and reduce your speed. Know what's going on around you.

Distance – Give snowplows room to work. The plows are wide and can cross the centerline or shoulder. Don't tailgate or try to pass. If you must pass, take extreme caution and beware of the snow cloud.

Vision – A snowplow operator's field of vision is restricted. If you cannot see the plow's side mirrors, the driver cannot see you. Stay two to three car lengths behind the plow and watch for sudden stops or turns.

Ice & Snow ... Take It Slow – Snowplows travel well below the posted speed limit. Be patient. Try not to pass the plow.

Beware of Snow Clouds – Snowplows often create clouds as they clear the roads. These snow clouds can reduce your ability to see.

SNOW EMERGENCIES WILL BE ANNOUNCED/POSTED ON THE WEBSITE, CodeRed, AND WFMZ TV.

REMINDER: VEHICLES NEED TO BE REMOVED FROM SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTES OR THEY WILL BE TOWED. PLEASE SAVE THE POLICE TIME & EFFORT BY REMOVING YOUR VEHICLES PROMPTLY.



EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

The Borough uses the Code Red System to notify residents and businesses about emergencies and general notifications, such as trash pickup changes.

If you are signed up, please verify that all your contact information is correct. If you have made any changes to you email, cell number and/or landline, it must be changed or removed from the CodeRed system.

If you are new to the Borough please sign up for notifications with CodeRed. Access the CodeRed system through the link on the home page of the Borough website @ www.stlawboro.com . CodeRed will be used for emergency notifications (snow emergency, etc.) and general notifications (trash day change). Any questions, please contact the Boro Office.

If you no longer wish to receive calls, texts or emails and/or are moving out of the Borough, please call the Borough Office and provide all your contact information so we may add it to the DO NOT CONTACT list.

This is the quickest method we have for contacting the Borough residents in Case of Emergency. We avoid making excessive contacts.

SNOW PLOWING INFORMATION

The Borough is not responsible for plowing the streets from curb to curb or for cleaning the space around your **mailbox or driveway**. Residents should park their vehicles off of the street to prevent your vehicle from being plowed in; providing the plow driver the space required to clean the roadway. The plow makes one pass to open the street and returns later to clear the driving lanes. Please do not clear your driveway until after the plow truck has finished.

When a snow emergency is declared promptly remove your vehicle from the snow emergency routes. If your vehicle is parked on a Borough Street that is not a Snow Emergency Route and you have space to move the car off the street, please do so. Any vehicle removed from the streets makes plowing easier and safer for the plow drivers.

As a reminder, Perkiomen Avenue, St. Lawrence Avenue and Oley Turnpike Road are state roads and will not be plowed by the Borough. Contact PennDOT Berks County Maintenance @ 610-929-0766 with any issues concerning the State Roadways (Perkiomen Avenue, Oley Turnpike Road and Saint Lawrence Avenue).

If you see an unsafe condition or an emergency on Borough roads that needs attention please call Derrek Rhoads at 484-577-9981 or contact the Borough office at 610-779-1430. Please do not call to ask when your road will be plowed. Please note that if a snow emergency is declared, your cooperation is required in order to properly clear the roadways.

All residents are reminded that by state law and Borough Ordinance your sidewalk must be cleared within 24 hours after the snow has stopped. Please be aware that children walk to and from bus stops and if your sidewalk is not cleared children may be forced to walk in the street which can be extremely dangerous especially along St. Lawrence Avenue.

DO NOT THROW, SNOWBLOW OR PLOW SNOW ONTO OR ACROSS ANY PUBLIC STREET IN THE BOROUGH. IT IS A VIOLATION OF LAW AND YOU WILL BE TICKETED BY THE POLICE.

SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTES

YOU MUST REMOVE YOUR VEHICLE IN A DECLARED EMERGENCY OR IT WILL BE TOWED

If you will be out of town, make arrangements for someone to move your vehicle or don't park your vehicle on a Snow Emergency Route.

Elm St.: Even Number (West) Side For Its Entire Length

Patton St.: Walnut St To Brown St Both Sides

Patton St: Brown St To Elm St. : Even Number (South) Side

Lynn Court: Entire Length Both Sides And Circle

Orchard Court: Entire Length Both Sides And Circle

Penn's Court: Entire Length Both Sides And Circle

THE BOROUGH CONTRACTS WITH THE ANIMAL RESCUE LEAGUE FOR

2022 ANIMAL CONTROL SERVICES

Services offered to residents of the Borough through the contract, beginning January 1, 2021:

- Transport (when available) and animal holding services for stray domestic cats and dogs regardless of behavior, medical or capacity status. They will pursue contact of owner. 24/7-365.
- Animal holding services for stray domestic dogs regardless of behavior, medical or capacity status. Emergency overnight service. Limited, emergency-only transportation available for aggressive or severely injured animals or by request of a police officer. They will pursue contact of owner. 24/7-365.
- Enforce Dog Law with Pennsylvania State Certified Humane Law Officers, including dogs at large, dog bites, dog licenses and cat/dog vaccinations
- Support local and state police, county sheriffs and constables with search warrants; investigations of dangerous dogs; and removal of animals following evictions or involved in accidents.
- Support state and county health department with investigation/confirmation of dog/cat bites/scratches; and implementation, compliance and completion of home/shelter quarantines.
- Investigate animal cruelty and neglect complaints with Pennsylvania State Certified Humane Officers
- Priority access to owners who wish to surrender their pets (owner pays \$50 fee)
- Hoarding case management and humane removal of live/deceased animals
- Pickup of rabid, seriously injured, diseased or dangerous animals. Testing of rabid animals.
- Community access to reduced-price microchip, vaccine or spay/neuter clinics. ARL pursues animal-related grants to expand these services and offer them at low or no cost to eligible municipal residents.
- Comprehensive and targeted spay/neuter, vaccination and microchipping programming to control and reduce the free-roaming community cat population.
 Outcomes include adoption or Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR).
- Access to an ARL representative during business hours, 7 days a week, for questions concerning humane law, animal control and non-cruelty concerns.
- Includes an answering service and emergency response by an ARL representative 24/7 365, including holidays.

INVASIVE PEST - SPOTTED LANTERNFLY

The spotted lanternfly (SLF) adults have laid their eggs on any surface they may find, including trees, rocks, side of a building and cement

blocks. Through the winter months, egg scraping or smashing eggs remains the management option for controlling the spread . The Department of Agriculture recommends removal of the egg masses by scraping them into a bag or container with rubbing alcohol or hand sanitizer and throwing it in the trash. An easier method would be to crush the egg mass. A wallpaper seam roller works well crushing the egg masses. To assist in identification, below are pictures of the SLF egg masses. The eggs are covered by wax when first laid, with the wax looking light gray, but dries to a mud like appearance.

Any effort to control the SLF on your property or in your community helps to prevent their spread.

Egg scraping, an effective means of removing eggs from trees and other surfaces. Walk around your property to check for egg masses on trees, cement blocks, rocks, and any other hard surface. If you find egg masses on your property from September to May, you can scrape them off using a plastic card or putty knife. Scrape them into a bag

or container filled with rubbing alcohol or STEPS OF SPOTTED LANTERNFLY MANAGEMENT hand sanitizer and keep them in this solu-

tion permanently. Egg masses can also be 1. smashed. Remember that some eggs will be unreachable at the tops of 2. trees, in other well-hidden areas, and throughout your neighborhood and community. Be aware that this method may not reduce the number of nymph or adult SLF you see later in the year.

REMOVE AILANTHUS TREES

- Stop the spread
- Scrape egg masses
- Use tree traps to catch nymphs
- **Remove host plants**

Ailanthus altissima, the tree preferred by the spotted lantern^{fl}y is itself an invasive plant. You can't just cut down the tree. If you do it will sprout many shoots.

- Destroy approximately 90% of the Ailanthus altissima trees, leaving only a few that are most attractive to the insect. They will serve as "trap" trees. It is recommended that you try to kill all the female Ailanthus altissima trees, because they produce seed and contribute to the spread of this invasive tree.
- Be careful handling *Ailanthus altissima* wood, leaves and branches. Chemicals in the sap of this tree can cause headaches, nausea and possible heart problems. Wear gloves and protect yourself from exposure.
- When you cut down *Ailanthus altissima* trees, they will sprout profusely from the stumps and can grow back in a few years. Because they regenerate so easily, it is recommended that you treat the stumps with an herbicide to kill them and prevent them from sprouting new shoots.

Herbicides that are labelled for this use usually contain one of the following active ingredients triclopyr, dicamba, imazapyr or glyphoshate. Use the herbicide carefully and according to directions on the label. Alternative methods for using herbicides to kill Alianthus altissima trees include foliar sprays, basal bark applications and a method called frill application or "hack and squirt".

BURNING OF LEAVES, BRUSH AND TRASH- PROHIBITED IN THE BOROUGH

Outdoor open burning (including incinerators, barrels or similar items) is banned in the Borough. DO NOT BURN TRASH OR CON-STRUCTION DEBRIS.

One farm in the Borough may open burn for agricultural purposes with a permit.

- 1. Fire pits, fire rings, outdoor fireplaces and chimineas are permitted so long as (Ordinance #388):
- 1. Used in a safe manner
- 2. Have a SPARK ARRESTOR in place during use AND BE A MINIMUM OF 10 FEET FROM A BUILDING.
- 3. Burn only dry wood.
- 4. NO TRASH IS BURNED, especially plastics.
- 5. Don't cause a nuisance. If asked by your neighbor to put out your fire, do it. Your neighbor doesn't want to smell your fire pit.
- 6. Before lighting your fire, check weather conditions. Don't burn if it is windy, the ground is excessively dry or if there is low cloud cover.

- ◆ LOCK YOUR VEHICLES PARKED IN YOUR DRIVEWAY AND ON THE STREET DON'T LEAVE CHANGE OR OTHER ITEMS VISIBLE TO THIEVES WALKING BY
- All vehicles must have current registration and inspection in order to park on a public street; otherwise they are considered abandoned and are subject to towing and fines.

- Be careful driving on wet leaves. Getting a monitored home alarm system you need a permit, call the Borough for details.
- As you drive, watch for children playing outdoors and riding wheeled vehicles.

Licensing your dog: it's part of being a responsible pet owner. Do it for them, do it for every dog in PA.

• If a dog gets lost, a license is the best way to get him/her back. A license helps animal control and shelters identify a dog and its rightful owners.

It's the law. All dogs three months and older must be licensed by January 1st.

• The cost of a license is less than the penalty for being caught without one. Owners who fail to license their dogs could face a fine of up to \$300 for each unlicensed dog.

• License fees support animal control. The annual fee to license a dog helps keep shelters running and supports the work of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture's Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement, which provides a number of vital services to protect dogs and the public. Last year, the Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement:

- O Enforced health and safety regulations in kennels by licensing 2,428 such operations and conducting more than 5,200 inspections.
- O Helped to secure more than 4,500 stray dogs, placing them in shelters until those that were licensed could be reunited with their owners.
- O Issued more than 3,000 citations and filed 115 misdemeanor complaints for violations of the Dog Law, including failing to license dogs, abandoning dogs, and allowing them to run at large.
- O Investigated nearly 1,500 dog bites, and they investigated and monitored 587 dogs that were deemed dangerous by magisterial judges.

Pennsylvania's Dog Laws:

- * If your dog is not licensed, you may be fined up to \$300 per dog. Get a license at your county treasurer's office.
- * Your dog must be under control and supervised at all times. You are responsible for any damages caused by your dog on someone else's property.
- * It is illegal to mistreat or abuse animals. Report suspected abuse to your local humane organization or police.
- * Purposely poisoning a dog, whether it is yours or someone else's, is illegal.
- * You may not abandon or attempt to abandon any dog. You could be fined \$1,000 plus court costs.
- * Puppies under eight weeks old cannot be bartered, traded, sold, or transferred.
- * You must have a kennel license if you keep, sell, transfer, adopt or foster at least 26 dogs in a calendar year.
- * If your dog attacks or kills a human or domestic animal without provocation, it may be considered dangerous. You may face extensive fines and restrictions.

Pennsylvania's Rabies Law:

Ignoring Pennsylvania's rabies vaccination law can be costly – in more ways than one. Dogs and cats are exposed to the rabies virus through wild and stray animals, posing a threat to their health and yours.

- * Dogs and cats three months or older must have a current rabies vaccination
- Owners of non-vaccinated pets may be fined up to \$300 plus court costs
- * Licensed veterinarians can vaccinate dogs and provide a vaccination certificate
- * Dog wardens perform random checks to ensure rabies vaccinations are current
