Ordinance No. 443

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ST. LAWRENCE, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, LAYING OUT, OPENING, ADOPTING, AND ORDAINING AS A PUBLIC STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF ST. LAWRENCE THE AREA DESIGNATED AS THE "STUB STREET" OF JACKSONWALD AVENUE, BETWEEN SEIDEL STREET AND TROUT STREET, HAVING A LENGTH OF 145 FEET AND A WIDTH OF 36 FEET, AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH ENGINEER AND THE BOROUGH SOLICITOR TO TAKE ALL ACTIONS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, REPEALER OF INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the street hereafter designated has been located in the Borough of St. Lawrence, Berks County, Pennsylvania; and,

WHEREAS, its location has been set forth and described upon the topographical survey of the Borough as the same was duly adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby enacted and ordained, by the Borough Council of the Borough of St. Lawrence, Berks County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

Section 1. Ordained Street. The area designated and known as the "Stub Street" of Jacksonwald Avenue, between Seidel Street, and Trout Street, having a length of 145 feet and a width of 36 feet, is adopted, opened, laid out, and ordained as a public street of the Borough of St. Lawrence, Berks County, Pennsylvania, as the same is set forth on the topographical survey of the Borough.

Section 2. Authorized Action by Borough Engineer. The Borough Engineer is authorized and directed to proceed as necessary with any revisions needed to the topographical survey to carry out the purposes of this Ordinance.

Section 3. Authorized Action by Borough Solicitor. The Borough Solicitor is authorized and directed to proceed as necessary to carry out the purposes of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Severability. If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Borough Council of the Borough of St. Lawrence that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

Section 5. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they are inconsistent with this Ordinance.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective on the earliest date allowed by law.
