CURBSIDE WEEKLY YARD WASTE/LEAF PICKUP PROGRAM - MONDAY'S

The weekly curbside pickup program continues year round on a Monday, weather permitting. All yard waste, including leaves, must be bagged in **paper** yard waste bags, **plastic bags will be left at the curb**, or small bundles of branches that can be picked up by one person without falling apart. **IF YOU HAVE MORE THAN 3 BUNDLES OF BRANCHES FOR PICKUP PLEASE CALL THE BOROUGH OFFICE TO ARRANGE PICKUP.**

You must call the Borough office by 9 AM every Monday, weather permitting, for pickup that day. If you leave a message, please state the following: address and number of bags and/or bundles for pickup. YOU MAY TEXT MESSAGE THE BOROUGH FOR PICKUP AT 610-655-5243. DO NOT PLACE YOUR BAGS CURBSIDE UNTIL THE NIGHT BE-FORE PICKUP. In January, Christmas trees, with all decorations including lights, removed may be placed at the curb for pickup. YOU MUST CALL THE OFFICE FOR PICKUP. DO NOT place Christmas trees or yard waste out for trash pickup, it is not part of the Borough contract.

CURFEW HOURS EXTENDED FOR HALLOWEEN

Council extends, by Resolution, the normal curfew time (Midnight to 5:00 AM, official prevailing time) to **9 PM to 6 AM, official prevailing time, from October 16th until November 1st**. All minors under the age of 18 may not be out upon any of the streets, alleys, parks or public places during the curfew unless accompanied by a parent or person charged with control after an event or activity, traveling to or from an event or activity or going to or from work. TRICK OR TREAT NIGHTS - OCTOBER 30th & 31st - 5 PM TO 9 PM

The Borough asks that a parent, guardian or responsible adult accompany children during the Halloween Trick or Treat Nights. If kids are on their own, remember the curfew. Those willing to have Trick or Treaters stop by, please turn on your outside lights. Those who are trick or treating, please do not stop at a home with no exterior lights turned on.

ELECTION DAY - TUESDAY NOVEMBER 2nd - 7 AM TO 8 PM

BOROUGH HALL WILL BE OPEN FOR VOTING ON ELECTION DAY. A parking lot is located at the rear of Boro Hall. All voters should enter in the rear door and leave through the front doors to maintain social distancing. Voting takes place on the first floor in Council Chambers (Tecklenburg Hall). TROUT RUN BRUSH DEPOSITORY

ALL CARDS ARE ISSUED BY EXETER TOWNSHIP, IF YOU HAVE A PROBLEM CONTACT THE TOWNSHIP

St. Lawrence residents may take their leaves and other yard waste to the Trout Run Brush Depository located at the Trout Run Sports & Recycling Complex at the intersection of West Neversink Road and East Neversink Road.

You need an ACCESS CARD to enter and leave the facility. If you do not have a card, you may acquire a card at the Exeter Township Municipal Building for \$10/ANNUALLY. If you have a card and haven't paid the fee this year, your card is deactivated.

DO NOT DUMP TRASH OR CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS OF ANY KIND; IT IS EXPRESSLY PROHIBITED ALONG WITH CAR-RYING A FINE OF \$600 PER OFFENSE. CAMERAS MONITOR THE DEPOSITORY AT ALL TIMES.

The Depository opens daily at 8 AM to 8 PM until November 7 when it closes at 6 PM, Standard Time. **The system locks the** gates at the precise times, you must be outside the gate or you will be LOCKED IN.

TRIM YOUR TREES AND OVERGROWN BUSHES



Low hanging trees over streets and sidewalks, along with bushes growing over the sidewalk hinder the safe passage of pedestrians and vehicles. Pedestrians need to duck for low hanging branches or walk in the street because of overgrowth. Lack of visibility of regulatory sign, such as speed limit and stop signs, can cause accidents.

Trees limbs need to be trimmed to 14' above a street and 8' above a sidewalk. All bushes must be trimmed to prevent any portion from hanging over a sidewalk or the street. It is the property owners responsibility to keep their trees and bushes trimmed.

The Borough will place hang tags on the front doors of properties that have violations. The hang tag will state what is in violation and the amount of time

to correct the violation. The use of hang tags seek voluntary compliance in addressing these safety issues; but begins the enforcement process.

If the violation remains uncorrected, a Notice of Violation will be sent requiring compliance, along with stating the consequences of failing to comply.

In the winter, the weight of ice and snow cause low hanging limbs to droop further. In addition to vehicle and pedestrian safety, without the removal of overgrowth along streets and hanging limbs, vehicle parking and snow plowing becomes more difficult.

BURNING OF LEAVES, BRUSH AND TRASH- PROHIBITED IN THE BOROUGH

Outdoor open burning (including incinerators, barrels or similar items) is banned in the Borough except for agricultural purposes with a permit. Fire pits, fire rings, outdoor fireplaces and chimineas are permitted so long as :

- Used in a safe manner 1
- 2. Have a SPARK ARRESTOR in place during use AND BE A MINIMUM OF 10 FEET FROM A BUILD-ING.
- 3. Burn only dry wood.
- 4. NO TRASH IS BURNED, especially plastics.
- 5. Don't cause a nuisance. If asked by your neighbor to put out your fire, do it. Your neighbor doesn't want to smell your fire pit.
- Before lighting your fire, check weather conditions. 6. Don't burn if it is windy, the ground is excessively dry or if there is low cloud cover. (Ordinance #388)

ELECTRONIC TRASH (E-WASTE)

E-WASTE: DESKTOP AND NOTEBOOK COMPUT-

ERS: COMPUTER MONITORS: AND COMPUTER PERIPHERALS keyboards, printer or any other device sold exclusively for external use with a computer that provides input into or output from the computer.

THESE DEVICES MAY NOT BE PLACED IN MUNICIPAL TRASH, IT IS A VIOLATION OF STATE LAW. IF ANYONE PLACES AN E-WASTE DEVICE FOR CURBSIDE TRASH PICKUP, THE HAULER WILL LEAVE THE ITEM AT THE CURB. YOU MUST REMOVE THE ITEM FROM THE CURB IMMEDIATELY.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS BY **ORDINANCE ON BOROUGH STREETS**

The following shall not be parked or stored on Borough Streets except for the time period in which they are loaded or unloaded. All trailers must be attached to a motor vehicle. The parking or storage of these items on the streets is deemed to be a traffic hazard injurious to the public interest. The Police are authorized to enforce this ordinance.

INVASIVE PEST - SPOTTED LANTERNFLY INFORMATION PROVIDED BY











A SPOTTED LANTERNFLY EGG MASS IMAGE: EMELIE SWACKHAMER

The spotted lanternfly (SLF) adults have begun to lay their eggs on any surface they may find, including trees, rocks, side of a building and cement blocks. Egg laving will continue through several hard frosts. The Department of Agriculture recommends removal of the egg masses by scraping them into a bag or container with rubbing alcohol or hand sanitizer and throwing it in the trash. An easier method would be to crush the egg mass. A wallpaper seam roller works well crushing the egg masses. To assist in identification, below are pictures of the SLF egg masses. The eggs are covered by wax when first laid, with the wax looking light gray, but dries to a mud like appearance.

Egg scraping, an effective means of removing eggs from trees and other surfaces. Walk around your property to check for egg masses on trees, cement blocks, rocks, and any other hard surface. If you find egg masses on your property from September to May, you can scrape them off using a plastic card or putty knife. Scrape them into a bag

or container filled with rubbing alcohol or STEPS OF SPOTTED LANTERNFLY MANAGEMENT hand sanitizer and keep them in this solu-

tion permanently. Egg masses can also be smashed. Remember that some eggs will be unreachable at the tops of 2. trees, in other well-hidden areas, and throughout your neighborhood 3. and community. Be aware that this method may not reduce the number $\frac{1}{4}$ of nymph or adult SLF you see later in the year.

REMOVE AILANTHUS TREES

Ailanthus altissima, the tree preferred by the spotted lanternⁿy is itself an invasive plant. You can't just cut down the tree. If you do it will

- sprout many shoots. Destroy approximately 90% of the Ailanthus altissima trees, leaving only a few that are most attractive to the insect. They
- will serve as "trap" trees. It is recommended that you try to kill all the female Ailanthus altissima trees, because they produce seed and contribute to the spread of this invasive tree.
- Be careful handling Ailanthus altissima wood, leaves and branches. Chemicals in the sap of this tree can cause headaches, ٠ nausea and possible heart problems. Wear gloves and protect yourself from exposure.
- When you cut down *Ailanthus altissima* trees, they will sprout profusely from the stumps and can grow back in a few years. Because they regenerate so easily, it is recommended that you treat the stumps with an herbicide to kill them and prevent them from sprouting new shoots.

Herbicides that are labelled for this use usually contain one of the following active ingredients triclopyr, dicamba, imazapyr or glyphoshate. Use the herbicide carefully and according to directions on the label. Alternative methods for using herbicides to kill Alianthus altissima trees include foliar sprays, basal bark applications and a method called frill application or "hack and squirt".
