SUMMER PLAYGROUND PROGRAM JUNE 9TH to AUGUST 1st

PLAYGROUND CLOSED ON JULY 4TH

The summer playground program starts 9 AM on June 9th, weather permitting (see Inclement Weather Statement). The playground program consists of a morning session from 9 AM to Noon and an evening session from 6 PM to 9 PM. CHILDREN 6 YEARS OF AGE AND YOUNGER MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY

AN ADULT OR BABYSITTER (16 OR OLDER). We operate an at-will program, there are no sign in or sign outs. Children are free to leave the playground at any time.

REGISTRATION REQUIRED TO ATTEND - NO FEE FOR ATTENDANCE.

 - * You must return the signed Child Registration page. If your child(ren) are not registered, they may not participate in organized activities.
 - * You must return the signed Acknowledgement of Playground Rules Page. These rules are strictly en-forced. Parents will be contacted if infractions occur. Any questions, contact the Borough Office.
- If you have any questions about the operation of the playground program, please contact the Borough Office.
- Children must wear appropriate footwear, not flip flops or sandals. They will not be allowed to participate in sport activ- ities.
- Some arts and crafts projects may have a small fee \$1.00 or less.

E-WASTE: TELEVISIONS, DESKTOP AND NOTEBOOK COMPUTERS; COMPUTER MONITORS; AND COMPUTER PERIPHERALS - keyboards, printer or any other device sold exclusively for external use with a computer that provides input into or output from the computer. YOU CAN DONATE COMPUTER RELATED ITEMS AT THE GOODWILL DONATION CENTER AS PART OF DELL RECONNECT INDO TELEVISONS ACCEPTED





THESE DEVICES MAY NOT BE PLACED IN MUNICIPAL TRASH, IT IS A VIOLATION OF STATE LAW. IF ANYONE PLACES AN E-WASTE DEVICE FOR CURBSIDE TRASH PICKUP, THE HAULER WILL LEAVE THE ITEM AT THE CURB. YOU MUST REMOVE THE ITEM FROM THE CURB IMMEDIATELY.

IF THE BOROUGH MUST REMOVE THE ITEM YOU WILL BE CHARGED FOR THE COST OF REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS BY ORDINANCE ON BOROUGH STREETS

The following shall not be parked or stored on Borough Streets except for the time period in which they are loaded or unloaded.

The parking or storage of these listed items on the Borough streets is deemed to be a traffic hazard injurious to the public interest.

* Truck Tractor *Boat Trailer * Truck Tractor Trailer

*Trailer *Tent Trailer *Recreational Equipment

*Boat *Cargo Trailer *Motorized Dwellings

*Motor Homes *Travel Trailer * Equipment Trailer

ALL TRAILERS MUST BE ATTACHED TO A LICENSED AND INSPECTED VEHICLE.

THE POLICE ARE AUTHORIZED TO ENFORCE THIS ORDINANCE.

COURTESY NOTICE - VIOLATION HANG TAGS

Borough Staff place hang tags on the doors of residential and commercial properties with Property Maintenance Violations. The hang tag states the specific violation and the amount of time to correct the issue. Hang tags seek voluntary compliance in a cost-effective manner that addresses safety issues; and begins the enforcement process.

Violation examples include **low-hanging tree limbs over streets and sidewalks** and **bushes growing over the sidewalk**, hindering the safe passage of pedestrians and vehicles. Pedestrians must duck for low-hanging branches or walk in the street because of overgrowth. Lack of visibility of regulatory signs, such as speed limit and stop signs, can cause accidents. Tree limbs **must be trimmed to 14' above a street and 8' above a sidewalk**.

A few examples of property maintenance violations: grass and weed height above 10", accumulation of trash, not keeping a pool in a sanitary condition, unsafe exterior structures, unlicensed/unregistered motor vehicles, and inoperable/ unassembled vehicles. If the violation remains uncorrected, we will send a Notice of Violation requiring compliance and stating the consequences of failing to comply. Currently occurring, active enforcement of grass/weed height and unsanitary swimming pool conditions, which become breeding areas for mosquitoes. West Nile Virus is an issue.



EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

The Borough uses the Code Red System to notify residents and businesses about emergencies and general notifications, such as trash pickup changes.

If you are signed up, please verify that all your contact information is correct. If you have made any changes to your email, cell number and/or landline, it must be changed or removed from the CodeRed system.

If you are new to the Borough, please sign up for notifications with CodeRed. Access the CodeRed system through the link on the home page of the Borough website @ www.stlawboro.us. CodeRed will be used for emergency notifications (snow emergency, etc.) and general notifications (trash day change). Any questions, please contact the Boro Office.

If you no longer wish to receive calls, texts or emails and/or are moving out of the Borough, please call the Borough Office and provide all your contact information so we may add it to the DO NOT CONTACT list.

This is the quickest method we have for contacting the Borough residents in Case of Emergency. We avoid making excessive contacts.

The weekly curbside pickup program continues year round on a Monday, weather permitting. All yard waste, including leaves, must be bagged in **paper** yard waste bags OR REUSEABLE YARD WASTE TOTES. Yard waste placed in **trashbags will be left at the curb**. Small bundles of branches or branches no larger that 4' that can be picked up by one person may also be place for pickup. **IF YOU HAVE MORE THAN 3 BUNDLES OF BRANCHES FOR PICKUP PLEASE CALL THE YARD WASTE LINE TO ARRANGE PICKUP.**

You must call the Borough office by 9 PM Sunday evening for a Monday pickup. If you leave a message, please state the following: address and number of bags and/or bundles for pickup. DO NOT PLACE YOUR BAGS CURBSIDE UNTIL THE NIGHT BEFORE PICKUP. **IF YOU CALL ON MONDAY (BY 9 AM), YOU MUST LEAVE A MESSAGE ON THE YARD WASTE LINE OR SEND A TEXT MESSAGE TO BE INCLUDED FOR PICKUP. DO NOT** place yard waste out for trash pickup, it is not part of the Borough contract. Yard waste adds excessive weight to the trash load. The Borough uses trash weights in the Trash Collection bidding process.

THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND WHEN YOU MAKE IMPROVEMENTS TO YOUR PROPERTY

DO NOT PLACE ANY FENCES, TREES, SHRUBS, PLANTS, ETC. WITHIN 8' OF A STREET CURB LINE (SOME STREETS REQUIRE 10'). THIS SPACE RESERVED FOR UTILITIES AND SIDEWALKS (EVEN IF YOU DON'T CURRENTLY HAVE SIDEWALKS). IF YOU PLANT IN THESE SPACES OR HAVE PLANTS OR OTHER OBJECTS IN THE SPACE, THEY MAY NEED TO BE REMOVED. DO NOT PLANT NEXT TO THE SIDEWALK AREA. PLANT ROOT SYSTEMS MAY DESTROY SIDEWALKS AND CURBS.

KEEP YOUR GRASS CLIPPINGS OUT OF THE STREET NO DUMPINGIN STORMDRAINS CHANNELSOR WATERWAYS

You are not permitted to dump anything into storm drains, storm channels or waterways. Grass clippings, leaves and other yard waste blown onto streets, dumped into storm drains or storm channels eventually wash into Antietam Building a deck more than 30" off the ground? plants, creating algae blooms and causing oxygen depletion making it difficult aquatic life to survive.

The Borough collects yard waste curbside weekly all year (weather permitting). See the Municipal Insert for instructions.

WASHING YOUR CAR AT HOME? DO IT ON YOUR YARD!

Outdoor car washing causes large amounts of dirt, road State Inspection Authority Inc. grime, oil and heavy metals to enter local waterways. [°] Soapy water flows down the street into the storm drains, eventually to be flushed through the system to Antietam Creek and the Schuylkill River. If you can't use a commercial car wash, wash your car on the lawn or other pervious surface so the wash water can soak into the ground and be filtered out.

ADOPT A STORM DRAIN

Have you noticed a storm drain clogged with leaves or trash? Have you seen how clogged storm drains can cause street flooding? Your help is needed to prevent the debris from blocking the storm drains or flowing into the Antietam Creek. Please contact Borough Hall if you see a clogged storm drain.

PERMITS REQUIRED FOR WORK

UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE (UCC) BUILDING, PLUMBING, ELECTRICAL AND

Pennsylvania State law requires that you, if you are doing the work yourself, or your contractor need to obtain a permit **PRIOR** to having any work completed on your property.

Depending upon the type and the complexity of the work you may need to have plans submitted for review and approval prior to having a Permit issued to complete the work. Permit applications are available online or in the Borough office. Permits are issued by the Borough's Building Code Official -

Additionally, all contractors and sub-contractors working on your property are required to obtain a BOROUGH TRADE REGISTRATION from the Borough office.

NOISE ORDINANCE

Be kind to your neighbors. Your taste in music is not necessarily that of your neighbors. Your music or any other noises, should not cross the property line or occur from 10:00PM until 7:00 AM, this includes power tools, revving of engines, velling shouting, singing, etc.

You are not allowed to operate construction equipment at any time on a SUNDAY or HOLIDAY (which can be heard on neighboring properties.)

JUST GOT AN INFLATABLEPOOL, I DON'T NEED A PERMIT, DO I?

YES, YOU DO! IT'S STATE LAW. ALL SWIMMING POOLS THAT HOLD MORE THAN 24 INCHES OF WATER REQUIRE A BUILDING, ELECTRICAL AND ZONING PERMITS PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION? INCLUDING INFLATABLE POOLS.

The Borough requires a Zoning approval for the placement of the pool, which includes placement a minimum of ten feet from the property line. A few of the State Building Code requirements for installing the pool are: a four foot fence with a self-locking gate around the pool or a fold-up ladder that locks; the type of fence construction and a GFCI outlet to run the pool filter. Extension cords not allowed. Other regulations apply depending upon the placement of the pool.

Anyone with a pool in their yard that doesn't meet Code Requirements will be asked to remove the pool until they obtain the proper permits and comply with safety measures.

TROUT RUN BRUSH DEPOSITORY

The Trout Run Brush Depository is a joint project of Exeter Township and the Borough and managed by the Township Highway Crew. The facility, located at the intersection of W. Neversink and E. Neversink Roads, accepts brush, grass clippings and Christmas trees only, delivered by the Property Owner.

The facility is monitored by cameras 24/7 and entry/exit requires an access card to open the gate. There is a \$25 annual fee for an access card and are available by application at the Exeter Township Municipal Building. There is a limit of one card per household and proof of residency or ownership is required. If Access card is lost or stolen, please notify EXETER TOWNSHIP and the card will be deactivated. To replace a card, the fee is \$25 and the previously issued card will be deactivated.

Landscaping companies doing work on residents' properties are not permitted to use Trout Run. Dumping construction debris or trash of any kind is expressly prohibited and carries a fine of up to \$600 per offense.
