I noticed the amount of kids at church is less than before, so I tried to think of a way to make St. Cecilia's feel more inviting to families. The play area will be located in the back of church and the busy bags will be able to be brought in and out of church. There will be bags geared towards older kids around ages 6 -10 and younger kids around ages 3-5.
