

GRATITUDE Capital Campaign

Did you know there's a home for retired priests of the Archdiocese? There is and you have an opportunity to share your gratitude by supporting the men who've ministered to you and your family for many decades.

The Leo C. Byrne Residence offers 29 individual apartments for priests who have reached retirement age, most of whom continue to actively serve parishes and organizations around the Archdiocese.

The GRATITUDE Capital Campaign Renovation Project (coordinated by the Catholic Community Foundation) will fund work required to bring the entire Byrne Residence to a level of security and efficiency suitable for the safety and well-being of each resident priest.

Registration for 2022-2023

Based on current conditions I am planning on the following:

• Catechesis of the Good Shepherd will continue on Sunday mornings during 10am Mass. Students in PreK-1st grade can attend. This will likely be twice a month, but may move to three times a month if we don't need to separate students into smaller groupings.

First Eucharist & Reconciliation preparation for 2nd graders (and others as needed) will also continue to take place during 10am Mass on Sunday mornings twice a month.

• Confirmation for 8th & 9th graders will take place on two Wednesday evenings a month and will line up with family formation.

Faith Formation will follow a multi-generational model with activities and service projects for all ages (including children already attending on Sundays). This will run from 6:30-7:30pm on Wednesday evenings twice a month. With the exception of our Confirmation students, children will remain in the hall with their families. These meetings may include station work, service projects, community building, prayer services, and more.

• The potluck meal will be available to those families who feel comfortable taking part in it. The meal would begin at 5:45pm and last until classes begin at 6:30pm. I plan to change our former procedure in a way that hopefully minimizes the risks that come with food-sharing. One example would be to have volunteers serve instead of having all participants dish themselves up. I'll be on the lookout for other ways to make this safer so please reach out if you have any suggestions.

As we see numbers return to pre-Covid levels we may break into grade level • groupings, but at this time we plan to keep families together.
