

Summer Build August 15th-19th

Tres Iglesias is an association of three neighborhood churches (St. Frances Cabrini, St. Cecilia's and Prospect Park United Methodist) who have joined together every year since 1992 to work on a Habitat for Humanity project in the Twin Cities area.

Volunteers are needed each day (Aug15-19) for the full shift from 8:30am to 3:30pm. For production and safety reasons there are no split shifts. You may work one or more days but must preregister. Lunch and snacks will be provided. You are encouraged to bring your own water bottle. Sign up is through the St. Frances Cabrini website here.

Donations are welcome to help offset our portion of the funds for the project build. Checks payable to St. Cecilia with a notation of "Habitat" may be placed in the regular collection basket during Mass or mailed to the parish office. Thank you!

COMMUNITY NEWS

Project Home

For over 23 years, Project Home has provided families with individualized, rapid stabilization case management, and surrounded them with the right support to help end family homelessness long-term. Did you know:

- The average stay at Project Home is 66 days
- Six months after moving in to stable housing, with support of their Rapid Exit Social Work Team, 91% of families are still in that housing
- Families participate in a budgeting/ savings program, leaving the shelter with an average \$1,000 in savings
- 54% of our guests are under 13 This year marks Project Home's one year anniversary at the Provincial House on the campus of St. Catherine's College, a partnership with the Sisters of St. Joseph and Ramsey County. There the families are provided with private rooms, home cooked meals, play and family space, tutoring for children, and

more. Those who have signed up will receive a reminder call and directions soon. We were gifted with donations to help with food or meals, as teams are asked to provide food and cook on-site with the weekend staff.

Registration for 2022-2023

Based on current conditions I am planning on the following:


• Catechesis of the Good Shepherd will continue on Sunday mornings during 10am Mass. Students in PreK-1st grade can attend. This will likely be twice a month, but may move to three times a month if we don't need to separate students into smaller groupings.



- First Eucharist & Reconciliation preparation for 2nd graders (and others as needed) will also continue to take place during 10am Mass on Sunday mornings twice a month.
- Confirmation for 8th & 9th graders will take place on two Wednesday evenings a month and will line up with family formation.
- Faith Formation will follow a multi-generational model with activities and service projects for all ages (including children already attending on Sundays). This will run from 6:30-7:30pm on Wednesday evenings twice a month. With the exception of our Confirmation students, children will remain in the hall with their families. These meetings may include station work, service projects, community building, prayer services, and more.
- The **potluck meal** will be available to those families who feel comfortable taking part in it. The meal would begin at 5:45pm and last until classes begin at 6:30pm. I plan to change our former procedure in a way that hopefully minimizes the risks that come with food-sharing. One example would be to have volunteers serve instead of having all participants dish themselves up. I'll be on the lookout for other ways to make this safer so please reach out if you have any suggestions.
- As we see numbers return to pre-Covid levels we may break into grade level groupings, but at this time we plan to keep families together.
