During the seasons of Lent and Advent we will be featuring a variety of voices from the community in our bulletin.

Reflection for the First Sunday of Lent By Marge Virnig

As I am anticipating Lent I am remembering a recent conversation I had with my six-year-old grandson, Major, that I would like to share:

Me: What does God look like?

Major: Well, people think he's mostly invisible but he's probably blue with white eyes.

Me: Huh? (My profound response)

Major: When you look up you think you see a blue sky with clouds but you are really looking at God. Or just look at anything and you will see God because God made everything.

Me: So God looks like whatever you are looking at?

Major: Sure. Even people. People just need to pay attention to what's going on in real life because that's where God is. If they don't believe and don't pay attention then they won't see God even though he's right in front of them.

Me: OK. (Another profound response)

Major: AND God talks to people all the time and wants to know what's up, but people can only hear him if they listen with their heart. Same with Jesus ... you know God has a kid named Jesus?

Me: That sounds about right. (Knocking it out of the park with my profound responses). What has God said to you lately? Major: We don't always need to talk. Sometimes we just hang out and chill. But he did tell me he knows I miss my Uncle Cody, but don't worry because he's safe with God and nobody can shoot him anymore. (Cody was shot outside First Avenue last summer in one of the "events" following the George Floyd killing).

The gospel for the first Sunday of Lent is about the temptation of Jesus. Mark's gospel doesn't describe how Jesus was tempted, but rather tells us to repent and believe. My grandson holds up those good news truths I need to remember, reflect, believe, and live in order to be a faithful disciple.

- I am created in God's image, but I am not God.
- You are created in God's image, but you are not God.
- God is present always and everywhere we just need to pay attention.
- God created everything we must recognize, honor and protect the dignity of all creation.
- Listen to the wisdom shared by others, including (and especially) children.
- Sometimes we just need to hang out with God and be quiet.

These are a few of my Lenten starters. I pray for the discipline to stay focused on them.
