

Why a St Cecilia's Pilgrimage of Hope for Creation?

In June the Catholic Bishops from poor nations across the Earth challenged the rich nations (the U.S. and others) to enter into an historic coalition between actors from the Global North and the South to face the (climate) crisis in solidarity. St Cecilia's pilgrimage is in solidarity.

Bishops from Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean issued a call for climate justice and the common home: ecological conversion, transformation and resistance to false solutions. The science is clear: we must limit global warming to 1.5°C to avoid catastrophic effects. We must never abandon this goal. It is the Global South and future generations who are already suffering the consequences.

The Bishops are calling for:

Equity: Rich nations should pay their ecological debt with fair climate finance without further indebting the Global South, to recover losses and damages in Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean, and Oceania.

Justice: Promote economic degrowth and phase out fossil fuels, ending all new infrastructure and properly taxing those who have profited from them, ushering in a new era of governance that includes and prioritizes the communities most affected by the climate and nature crises.

Protection: Defend indigenous peoples, ecosystems and impoverished communities; recognizing the greater vulnerability of women, girls and new generations; and climate migration as a challenge of justice and human rights.

St Cecilia's Pilgrimage of Hope for Creation Is scheduled for Sunday, September 14th—We will leave church at 10:30 and be back at church by 2:00 at the latest.

We will journey to Carondelet Village (near College of St Catherine) to learn about their success at reducing fossil fuel usage with geothermal for cooling and heating. Our Pilgrimage will include transportation, music, food and time to be with our St Cecilia community. All will be family friendly.

We had the first of our sessions for creating art for our September pilgrimage. You have two more chances to join in the fun: Sunday, August 3rd, right after Mass, and August 16th, Saturday afternoon at 2:30 (maybe stay for 4:30 Mass?). Come to talk, have some snacks, and learn about and celebrate God's Creation.

A note from the Finance Committee:

We are currently working to wrap up the reporting for our fiscal year, which ended on June 30, 2025. Thanks to your support, we exceeded our budget projections for operating revenues. Envelope and plate revenues increased 18% from 2024. In addition, our parish dinner contributed almost \$30,000 in net revenue. We also managed our expenses effectively (an increase of 4% from last year), resulting in an operating surplus. We also received an estate bequest during the year of \$39,000 (net). We used building fund contributions, a transfer from our permanent endowment and building fund reserves to fund over \$45,000 in building improvements during the year. Our cash and investment balances are strong, and we have no outstanding debt. We will provide a full update on the final results later this summer when the year-end close process is complete. Your ongoing support of the parish is appreciated!
