

#### World Day of the Poor

WASHINGTON - Since 2016, the Catholic Church has observed the World Day of the Poor on the 33rd Sunday of Ordinary Time as a way for Catholics to reflect more deeply on our call to love the poor as our brothers and sisters. On November 15-16, parishes in many Catholic dioceses throughout the United States are able to observe this year's World Day of the Poor by taking a collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD), the domestic anti-poverty initiative of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB).

Jesus reminds us that faith, even as small as a mustard seed, holds within it the power to transform the world. From something seemingly insignificant can grow a tree that offers shelter, hope, and new life. In many ways, that is the story of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development, founded by the bishops of the United States in 1969. Through CCHD, the Church lives out the Gospel call to solidarity, fostering the capacity of people experiencing poverty to work together to confront the roots of injustice and build stronger, more just communities," said Bishop Timothy Senior of Harrisburg, chairman of the bishops' Subcommittee on the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. "This same spirit of faith takes root in our own communities, where twenty-five percent of every CCHD collection stays within the diocese. These funds support local efforts that uplift our neighbors, strengthen families, and help build a future of hope."

CCHD provides crucial support to both growing and longstanding organizations that promote justice, neighborhood improvement, and job creation for marginalized groups in both urban and rural communities across the United States. In 2024, the bishops awarded \$2.24 million in grants.

World Day of the Poor is an invitation for us to pray and to act, to build a world that truly recognizes the God-given dignity of our brothers and sisters who are most vulnerable," Bishop Senior said. "One concrete way to respond to this call is by participating in the collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. I invite you to remember the Lord's words about the mustard seed: even the smallest act of faith can, through the grace of the Holy Spirit, grow into something that transforms lives and renews communities, both across our nation and within your own diocese."

A collection basket will stand near the church entryway to receive cash or check donations (payable to St. Cecilia). Envelopes and information sheets are available there.

### **How the Giving Tree Works**

We invite you to stop by the Link and consider fulfilling a **NEW** gift request for a student at Cesar Chavez School (CC) or a family member at Holy Rosary Church (HR). We have approximately 300 gift requests at a variety of prices and we welcome you to select more than one tag if you desire. Tags are color-coded; red for Cesar Chavez and green for Holy Rosary. All children ages 18 and younger receive two gifts; one clothing item and one fun item, but you are not required to select both tags.

If shopping online, please allow ample time for shipment to meet our Giving Tree deadline of Sunday, December 7th. If you prefer to make a monetary donation, we will use it to shop for you and/or purchase extra gifts as needed. Checks payable to St. Cecilia with a notation of "Giving Tree" are greatly appreciated. Please contact the parish office with any questions. Donations of new wrapping paper and scotch tape are also welcome.
