

Confirmation Candidates Focus on Service & Justice

During October and November, our Confirmation candidates have been focusing on service and justice. Included during this time was a visit to St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store on Lake Street and the George Floyd Memorial. It is a huge testament to our community that even with the weather (it was cold and snowy!) and the distance we had 100% of our families there -- many of them came in full force, along with several sponsors.



Before our visit, students collected personal care items to donate to St. Vincent. Because of the rioting that took place in that community there is no convenient place to purchase these items, so St. Vincent has been giving them away for free each week. Our students showed up with over 100 bags of items to donate!



From there we walked to the George Floyd Memorial to reflect and pray together. It was painful and uncomfortable, which was good for all of us. Painted on the street leading up to the memorial are the names of black men and women who have lost their lives. Some of our students counted those names...169. You will notice reference to this list in many of our students' reactions, which are below. Our community is full of pretty incredible and insightful young people.

Q: What did you feel?

Angry - Hurt - Astonished - Sad - Hopeful that things will change - Empowered to change - Weight of all the loss - Uncomfortable - Happy that we were able to help the community.

Q: What did you wonder about?

How will we change? How have we disregarded that "all men are created equal" for so long? Who is trying to make a change and how can I be a part of it? Why haven't I heard about so many of these people who have died? What is going to happen to the people who live in that community? What would these people have done with their lives if they didn't end so soon? How is



racism still here?

Q: What did you find most impactful about your experience?

I am thinking more about how to stop being subconsciously racist. I felt all the hurting that everyone was experiencing. No one was trying to cover the truth and the rawness of the situation. So many people live through this daily, and we need change. The fist gives so much hope that there will be change. I realize how much more this means to me and how much more I want this change.

The Thirty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, The Solemnity of Christ the King

Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17. Parable of the divine shepherd who rescues the scattered sheep, seeks out the lost, binds up the injured, heals the sick, judges between the wicked and the good.

Psalm 23. The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want.

1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28. In his resurrection, Christ represents the first fruits of all those who belong to him. He will hand over this kingdom to the Father.

Matthew 25: 31-46. The final judgment by the Son of Man, seated upon his royal throne, rewarding those who cared for him while caring for “my least brothers and sisters,” punishing those who did not care for him in these “my least.”


