

## The Church of Saint Cecilia

### Preparing for Word of God Sunday—January 25 Reflections by Arthur E. Zannoni

In 2020, Pope Francis initiated the Word of God Sunday. It was to be celebrated on the Third Sunday of Ordinary time to help all Catholics realize how important the Sacred Scriptures are in the practice of their faith.

For Catholics, the "Word of God" has a threefold meaning: Jesus Christ (the eternal Word made flesh), Sacred Scripture (the Bible), and Sacred Tradition (the teachings passed down through the Church's Magisterium). The Word of God, with its threefold meaning, is considered God's divine revelation (self-communication), purveyed through Christ, Scripture, and the living voice of the Church. These three form the basis for faith and life.

The Scriptures themselves tell us that "Indeed, the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing until it divides soul from spirit..." (Hebrews 4:12). "All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work." (2 Timothy 3:16-17). These passages tell us two things: first, that God wants to speak to us; second, that listening to God speak in the Sacred Scriptures is a way for us to grow into our fullest potential.

Before the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) most Catholics did not place much emphasis on reading the Bible. Since the council, we have begun to understand scripture as an essential part of our faith. At the opening of each daily session at the Council a liturgical minister would carry in procession a copy of the Bible. This was to remind the assembled bishops that one of the sources of faith is the Word of God in the Sacred Scriptures.

The Second Vatican Council teaches us that "It is Christ himself who speaks when the Holy Scriptures are read in the Church." "Sacred Scripture is of the greatest importance in the celebration of the liturgy." In addition, the bishops at the council said, "The treasures of the Bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that a richer share in God's word may be provided for the faithful." *Constitution on Sacred Liturgy* (# 7, 24 and 51). "The Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures just as she venerates the body of the Lord, since, especially in the Sacred liturgy, she unceasingly receives and offers to the faithful the bread of life from the table both of God's word and of Christ's body." (*Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation* #21).

St. Jerome reminds us that "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ." Pope Leo XIV at an audience in November 2025 said, "The church draws life not from herself but from the Gospel."

#### **Praying With and From the Sacred Scriptures**

Reflective reading of the scriptures can lead us into prayer. It can take many forms. One form is called *lectio divina*, from the Latin for "divine reading." It has a four-step pattern. **READING:** a slow and thoughtful reading of a passage from the Bible;

**MEDITATION:** A time of reflection and thinking about the meaning of that biblical text to me as a reader;

**PRAYER:** A period of prayer to God to bring the Bible's passage to fruition in myself;

**ACTION:** A decision on what I should do in my own life as a result, that is an action plan or decision to change or improve.

*Lectio divina* is simple to do, and you do not have to be a monk or a nun to do it. It can be done in any place at any time, as long or short as you wish to make it. The only real requirement is to concentrate on what you are doing in each of the four steps so that reading turns to prayer. Praying from, though, with, and in Scripture is what *lectio divina* is all about. Try it and it will help you to improve your prayer life.
