Reflection for the Second Sunday of Advent By Stephanie Weller Hanson

The Winding Road

"Prepare the way of the Lord. Make straight his paths. Every valley shall be filled and every mountain and hill shall be made low. The winding road shall be made straight."

For the people of Israel, mountains and hills and rugged footpaths were places of danger from both animal and human predators. Travelers would set out knowing that a plausible threat was always present. We have only to think of the Good Samaritan story to imagine that reality.

This past week, I spoke with a friend in another part of the country who is living through multiple layers of difficulty—a recent death in the family as well as issues with troubled teenage children, so that put a frame around my thoughts on these readings. My friend might well say that she feels like she's climbing a mountain of difficulty, that she's lost in an emotional wilderness, and can't find her way. It's something many of us have experienced. Our children, whether young or grown, are struggling; sometimes it's our parents who have health problems and must move out of their home. There's a painful divorce, or an addiction that destroys the well-being of the family. And saddest of all is the sharp stab of grief we feel for our lost loved ones. Like the Babylonian captives, we have been cut off from that which we love, and we long with all our hearts to find our way home again. So we sing today's psalm as an act of hope: "When the Lord brought back the captives of Zion/we were like people dreaming/then our mouth was filled with laughter/and our tongue with rejoicing."

Advent asks constancy of us, and patience, but always with the promise of coming joy. There may be no easy answers to the thorny struggles and sorrows we sometimes face, but we know that we are not alone. God makes his home within us. We are dwelling places of the Holy Spirit, and the Promised One comes to us again at Christmas.

Celebrating holiday liturgies during Covid

Our Liturgy Team met recently and discussed how to plan for our crowds during the holiday season. It is hard to predict if and when the present Covid surge will subside. Formerly, we offered a single service on Christmas Eve at 4:30pm (with Carols at 4:00) and one on Christmas morning at 10:00am. While the Eve mass has traditionally been more heavily attended, we chose to add an additional service on Christmas morning at 8:15. Our Christmas schedule thus more closely resembles our usual weekend schedule. We have had some overflow seating available in the Link and entryway and are exploring how to expand that with safe distancing and safety in mind.

Remember that we still post a recorded liturgy for holiday and Sunday services for those who are not able to comfortably or safely attend in person. We will continue to wear masks in our building when we gather and ask folks to safely distance as they are able. It is important that those attending are also fully vaccinated and boosters are highly recommended. We ask people to consider attending our Christmas Day options when planning their holidays to help us maintain safe environments throughout this weekend.

The New Year Holy Day in honor of Mary the Mother of God is not considered a day of obligation when it falls, as it does this year, on a weekend. We will, however, have a single Mass on Saturday morning for those who would like to join us to begin the New Year on this day of prayer for Peace.

Notice that there are no 4:30 Saturday evening masses on each of these consecutive weekends.

Sun, Jan. 2 Epiphany: Masses 8:15 and 10:00am.
