Journeying with Leo XIV: From Villanova to the Vatican

When Leo XIV first greeted Rome and the world, he identified himself as "a son of St. Augustine, an Augustinian." We will look to the spirituality of St. Augustine, the Rule of St. Augustine, and Augustinian spirituality to better understand the spirituality of the first Augustinian pope. We will reflect on his chosen name revealing a spirituality committed to justice and peace. Our presenter, Angela Senander, is a theologian who has taught with the Augustinians at Washington Theological Union and Merrimack College.
