

Video Presentation following 9:30am Mass

Domestic Violence Awareness Month was first observed in the US in October 1987. According to the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence, approximately 85% of domestic violence perpetrators in the US are male. So, after last October's DV Awareness presentation at St. Cecilia's, the unanswered question was: WHY? Why do men abuse?

We will find some insight when we watch a 20-minute film interview by Chuck Derry, one of the most important voices in this area of Domestic Abuse – from right here in Minnesota!

Join us downstairs after the 9:30am Mass. You will be able to see Derry's quite blunt explanation of why men abuse and batter.


