Giving Tree News

Saint Cecilia's will again be providing over 300 Christmas gifts to families who need help in our area this holiday season. We will once again provide gifts for students at Cesar Chavez School and family members at Holy Rosary Church.

Cesar Chavez school on the east side of Saint Paul has about 550 students grades pre-K to eighth grade. Their students are 99% minority and 83% are poor. They offer classes in both Spanish and English and they teach about Latino culture. They have some people who help them at Christmas time but they are always short of gifts and can't provide gifts for all the students

that need them.

We also give to members of Holy Rosary Catholic Church in Minneapolis. Those people are Hispanic immigrants and most don't have access to social services from the government.

Trees with the gift requests will be in the link November 15/16, November 22/23 and through Thanksgiving weekend November 29/30. All gifts must be returned to the link no later than Sunday, December 7th.

You have been so generous in the past and we hope to have a successful year once again. Thank you for your support.
