


WRITE A HOMONYM STORY FOR FUN!



Invite students to write homonyms on post-its and stick them on a CRANE AND CRANE book.

(In one classroom a student wrote the words sick and sic. When questioned by the teacher, the student gave an eye roll and explained that sic meant really cool).

Does this make hot and hot homonyms, too?

EXAMPLE HOMONYM STORY:

The fly couldn't fly so it climbed up the ruler in the Ruler's hand, then popped onto a can of blue pop, which blew up, propelling the fly into the air — and splat into a plain plane's propeller. The fly died flying.
