
Purpose

The purpose of the usability findings study was to test the effectiveness of the LEGO Drip Irrigation System instruction set. How well could the traditional undergraduate follow our instructions, would they give positive feedback or constructive feedback on what was good and areas of opportunity? The participants were handed a paper copy of the instructions and were asked to construct a drip irrigation system from the LEGO set that was provided to them by a group member. We each have chosen four different participants to construct the drip irrigation system from the LEGO set.

Pre-Test Questionnaire

The pre-test questionnaire consisted of seven questions that created an understanding of each participant. The likelihood of completing the instruction set, and their comfortability with instructions was gauged in the pre-test questionnaire. It was beneficial to find areas of improvement with the instruction set by understanding the participant. The following questions were assessed:

- The participant's age.
- If the participant was an undergraduate student.
- What was participant's skill level was putting following instructions?
- If the participant preferred written instructions, illustrated instructions or both.
- What did the participant like MOST and LEAST about a list of instructions?



The results from the pre-test questionnaire showed that the participants were a mix of undergrad students and non-undergrad and that most of them considered themselves very skilled at using instructions. An interesting result from the questionnaire was that none of the participants said that they preferred only written instructions, they all stated they preferred either illustrative only or both written and illustrative.

Observation Notes

Based on the observation notes from each participant we found that while the completion times varied, from 2:15 to 10:16, every participant was able to successfully complete the instruction set. We also found that only a couple of participants were distracted during the process while most remained focused until they completed the instructions. While observing each of the participants work through the instructions, particular attention was placed on observing any pain points that the participants experienced. Few pain points were found, but one that was observed for several participants was trying to determine what the small red pieces were and where to find them. Another pain point observed in some of the participants was having to sort through all the pieces to find the ones they needed to complete the instructions.

Post-Test Questionnaire

After completing the instruction set, each participant was asked several questions as part of a post-test questionnaire. The purpose of the post-test questionnaire was to determine each participant's thoughts about the instructions, what they liked most about the instructions, what they liked least, and whether they would recommend the instruction set to a friend and why. This information was then used to find potential areas that the instructions could be improved upon.

The results from the post-test questionnaire showed that most of the participants had a positive view of the instructions with many saying that the pictures were excellent and that the instructions overall were easy to follow. When asked what they liked most about the instructions, many stated they liked how colorful the instructions were, while several others liked how simple and easy to read the instructions were. Other things the participants liked about the instructions were having each step on a different page, having a required parts list, and that the instructions allowed them to finish the process.

When asked what they disliked about the instructions, several participants stated that there was nothing they disliked about the instructions, while others stated they didn't like that there was no video option in the instructions, the red pieces were hard to find, and that they didn't like the written instructions in each step. The final question asked to the participants was whether they would recommend this instruction set to a friend and nearly all the participants stated that they would recommend the instructions to a friend. When asked why, many stated it was because the instructions were easy to read/understand, the helpfulness of the instructions, and the inclusion of part numbers to help colorblind people. For the participants who said they would not recommend the instruction set to a friend it was because they said the instructions weren't too scale.

Conclusion

Overall, the results from testing the instructions were very positive as many of the participants found the instructions to be effective and easy to follow. After analyzing the results from the participants and our own observations throughout the process, we decided to keep many features of the instructions the same. However, we did find some areas where we could make improvements, including improving the scaling of the pictures to make them more realistic, adding more yellow into the instructions to follow the traditional LEGO theme, and including an introduction and conclusion to the instructions so that future readers have more knowledge about the irrigation system when they go to use the instructions.
