

## A Resolution addressing Domestic Violence

## **Committee: Women's Issues**

Resolution:WMN-20-04

- 1. WHEREAS, African American women experience Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) at a
- 2. rate of 35% higher than white women and scarcely 2.5% higher than women of other
- 3. races.
- 4. WHEREAS, Domestic violence is extremely under-reported due to social conditions,
- 5. distrust in law enforcements as well as religious beliefs within the African American
- 6. community.
- 7. WHEREAS, Both the long and short time effects of Domestic Violence may be greater
- 8. for African American women due to the exposure of external factors and social
- 9. conditions that increase chances of worse conditions.
- 10. WHEREAS, Domestic Violence has been labeled as the number one health issue facing
- 11. African American Women in the United States by the Black Women's Health Project.
- 12. WHEREAS, Association between dysthymia, alcohol dependence, drug abuse and
- 13. poverty has been linked to African American women who have been victims of
- 14. domestic violence abuse.
- 15. WHEREAS, African American women are 2.5% more likely to be murdered in a
- 16. domestic violence dispute than white women.
- 17. WHEREAS, The Lautenburg Amendment amended the Gun Control Act of 1968 which
- 18. previously banned those convicted of felony domestic violence offenses from legally
- 19. owning a gun.

- **20. WHEREAS,** There is a "boyfriend loophole" that lies within The Lautenburg
- 21. Amendment that allows domestic violence felony offenders to purchase guns only if they
- **22.** were not married to their victim.
- 23. WHEREAS, The Violence Against Women Act has played a crucial role in protecting
- **24.** women and families in the United States since 1994.
- 25. WHEREAS, The Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2019 would have
- 26. addressed and closed the loophole yet there has been no action taken since it was passed
- 27. in the House in April of 2019.
- 28. WHEREAS, Sen. Mitch McConnell allowed The Violence Against Women
- **29.** Reauthorization Act of 2019 expire over a year ago.
- **30. WHEREAS,** The Victims of Crime Act Fund (VOCA) has provided funding to federal
- 31. and state programs that assist victims of crime since 1984. VOCA uses non-taxpayer
- **32.** money from the Crime Victims Fund (CVF).
- **33. WHEREAS,** The VOCA funds that have been released annually have recently begun to
- **34.** decline due to a prosecutorial strategy that has changed over the last decade and is not
- **35.** specifically a partisan issue.
- **36. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that NOBEL Women support proper policing and
- 37. procedure to build up reliability in the law between domestic violence victims and
- **38.** government.
- **39. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that NOBEL Women urges states to enforce
- **40.** bystander prevention within corporate offices and schools.
- 41. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that NOBEL Women encourages easier access to
- **42.** healthcare through the Affordable Care Act due to Domestic Violence afflicting African

- **43.** American Women as a public health issue.
- **44. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that NOBEL Women supports the Reauthorization
- **45.** of The Violence Against Women Act of 2019.
- **46. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that NOBEL Women urges the language of the
- **47.** HEROES Act to be enacted to increase deposits to the Crime Victims Fund.
