<u>Carol Frazier, Legislative Chair</u> - Report distributed to all which included a summary on 2019 priority legislative issues, contact information for our MD representatives and resources to learn more. Carol stressed in order to boost our influence we need to get active. Sign up for MFRW email/text alerts, join weekly conference calls – free of charge. When contacting a representative, it is effective to write an email on a single issue. This is helpful on legislation we support as well as oppose. Letters to the editor and calls to local talk radio are also effective. Influence our own inner circle of friends/co-workers/family.

From Beth - MFRW has developed a list of legislative priorities.

From Pat Schrawder, representative for State Senator Mary Beth Carozza - its early but session is already very busy. Sanctuary State, Opioid Dens and 120 days Paid Leave for Seasonal Workers Act are on the agenda again. GOP voters over Dems number 3, 429 in Worcester Co.

Commissioner Bud Church, district 3 - Thanked Marlene Ott for fundraising to support the Coast Guard during the Gov't shutdown, the commissioners are also doing so by providing free meals. Susan Braniecki was acknowledged and thanked for her years of service. Beth Rodier welcomed to her new appointment to the Women's Commission. And a big thank you to the members of the RWWC for all we have done to promote the Republican Party in Worcester Co. A summary of the duties and responsibilities of the 7 commissioners given. Upcoming issues discussed - the budget, loan to fund the construction of the new Showell Elementary School, capital projects, increase income without raising taxes and the OC Tax Differential.
