Dates to be aware of are the following:

- Candidate Filing Deadline – Tuesday, February 24, 2026, at 9 PM
- RWWC & WCRCC Local Candidate Forum at the Ocean Pines Library at 11107 Cathell Rd, Ocean Pines, MD on Thursday, May 21, 2026, from 6 PM to 9PM
- Early Voting is from Thursday, June 11, 2026, through Tuesday, June 18, 2026; hours are from 7 AM to 8 PM daily (this includes Saturday and Sunday)
- Early voting location for Worcester County is the Ocean Pines Community Center, 235 Ocean Parkway Ocean Pines, MD 21811
- Primary Voting is Tuesday, June 23, 2026, from 7 AM to 8 PM, at your assigned polling place
- Mail-in ballots must be postmarked or placed in a designated ballot drop box by 8 PM on June 23, 2026, for the Gubernatorial Primary Election. (Note, USPS is not stamping a postmark at your local post office, it is being done at the distribution center, and this may be several days from when you dropped it in the mailbox.)

We will be reaching out for volunteers to assist at the polls during early voting. Please come and join us at the polls.

Officer’s Reports

Approval of Minutes - Gwen Crisafulli made one correction to the October 23rd General Meeting Minutes. She then asked for approval of the minutes as stated. Carol Frazier so moved. Susan Crisafulli seconded. MCU (Motion Carried Unanimously).

Asst. Treasurer/Membership - Linda Moran announced to the group that as of today we have 7 new members and 70 renewals. Linda informed all that were present that if their dues are not paid by the end of February, they will be removed from both the MFRW and

NFRW rosters. She introduced the new members that were present, and then the members introduced the guests they brought to the meeting.

Introduction of Speaker -Carol Frazier

Maria Sofia – Manager of Government Affairs at the Cato Institute and MFRW First VP

Maria Sofia addressed the group and began her presentation about Using AI in Your MFRW Club – Worcester Edition. Maria informed the group that there are primarily four AI chat engines. They include Chat GPT, Grok, Claude, and Gemini. She explained what each software is best for and which ones she prefers. She then gave the group tips on the best ways to use AI. These included asking clarifying questions, being specific, and giving clear instructions. Some things to avoid are using personal information like SS# and credit card information. Some ways it can be used with in the club is for press releases, announcements, event planning, fundraising ideas, letters to the editor and social media posts. Maria finished her presentation by answering member questions.
